## I AVOID TALKING ABOUT....

....Money. Most people do. In my therapy practice, people talk about their relationship problems, their addictions, their most shameful experiences, and their sex lives. But they don't talk about money.

In forty years of preaching, I never have preached a stewardship sermon. I carefully avoid knowing what people put in the offering plate. I squirm if people ask me about the fee for performing a wedding or a funeral. Setting a fee with a new client was always the hardest task for me.

But we're launching a Capital Campaign on March $10^{\text {th }}$. And I will be talking about money-and so will others.


Why is a Capital Campaign needed?
As I talked with some of our leaders, a basic guiding principle has emerged: we need to put our house in order before we turn more of our energies to reaching out, inviting, and serving others. continued on inside page $>$

The social hall, including bathrooms, needs major renovations.

And so, I will be talking about money. Call it stewardship, call it sacrificial giving, but it's really a conversation about each of us taking some of our resources and using it for the common good.

I think we have made the intelligent choice to make our Capital Campaign brief and to the point. It will begin on Sunday, March 10th and end on April 21st, Easter Sunday.

Please be prayerfully considering how you might respond with a joyful heart and generous spirit.

## CLC GOALS FOR 2019

At their Leaders' Retreat, the staff, Admin Team and Congregational Council looked at the key traits of healthy and growing congregations. Working together, they chose to focus on five goals for 2019:

1. Children's ministry that kids don't want to leave. This goes far beyond fun and games, but those are certainly part of it. Imagine kids being in an environment that allows them to understand God's love for them while being invested in by caring adults who partner with parents to disciple them.
2. Genuine heart for the lost and the desire to embrace the mess. Inward-focused churches are dying churches. Growing churches aren't just conscious of the lost, they pursue them and are ready to take on the messes of life they may bring.
3. Clear outward focus. Their members intentionally know non-believers. They provide evangelism training. Their budget reflects dollars spent to start new ministries and expand services. continued on next page >

5. Shareable Church Communication That Inspires and Informs. Too many churches do a bad job of communicating past Sunday morning. A church that is healthy and growing communicates constantly in a variety of ways.

## INVESTMENT FUNDS SAVINGS

At the February Congregational Council meeting our treasurer, Ray Lardin, announced he is able to lower the amount of money taken from our investments each month to meet the budget.

Instead of $\mathbf{\$ 9 , 0 0 0}$ each month, Ray will lower the amount to $\$ 8,000$ and perhaps even $\$ 7,600$. We are moving in the right direction!
