# STAY AT HOME MISSION WORK CAMP

As I'm sure most of you know, Stay at Home Mission Work Camp was started by Pastor George. Instead of heading to some distant locale, Pastor George saw that home repairs were needed for lower income families right in Millvale. My sense is that, even though other congregations support and participate in SHMWC, CLC emotionally considers it part of our ministry in the community.

So it was that I met on January 7th with Jerry Lynn, the Synod Disaster Response Coordinator, and one of the key adult leaders for SMHWC. From my perspective, we had a great meeting. We set the date for this summer, exchanged some ideas to improve the program, and I offered the talents of Aaron Jackson, to publicize the program on social media.

In addition, I was open about conflict with the Ingold family and that they had transferred to Emmanuel Lutheran in Etna. Nevertheless, I told Jerry I felt I could work with Pastor Chrissy Hough and pledged to do so. We shook hands and I felt good about this year's SHMWC.

On Friday, February 15th, CLC received a letter stating the "Board of SHMWC" was moving the SHMWC to St. John's Lutheran Church in Highland. Intuitively, an alarm went off about the finances

and I checked the SHMWC mailbox in the office. The Continued on next page >

bank statements were gone and the "SHMWC" label on the mailbox had been removed.

I called Jerry Lynn and asked him why SHMWC had been moved. He said that, although he urged that SHMWC remain at CLC, other Board members voted to move it out of the congregation. Even though there is no officially elected "Board," the usual "planning group" for SHMWC includes Pastor Chrissy Hough and her husband, Tom, Amy Scariot, Dean and Charalene Ingold, Chris Atwood, and Jerry and Sylvia Lynn.

When I told him about the missing bank statements, Jerry said knew nothing about it. The SHMWC is a CLC bank account at First National Bank in Millvale.

Paul Bell and I went to First National Bank on Tuesday, February 19th, and spoke with Perry, the bank manager. Turns out that on February 7th, Jerry Lynn wrote a check for \$5,333.53 from the SHMWC bank account to Emmanuel Lutheran Church in Etna, where his son, JJ Lynn is Pastor. This left a zero balance in the CLC SHMWC account.

I contacted the Bishop by email and related these events. He invited me to meet with he and Jerry Lynn to hear Jerry's perspective and to share my concerns. I declined to do so.

Tim Wach, Paul Bell, and I then spent many hours in the following weeks exploring the situation *Continued on next page >*  with an attorney and Tim Komoroski, the Millvale Chief of Police. We were told that these actions were unethical, and "shady," but they were not illegal. Jerry Lynn was on the signature card at the bank and so he had the right to write the check.

At its last meeting, your Congregational Council decided to invite the Bishop and Jerry Lynn to a meeting to discuss this situation. We will keep you informed of the outcome.

3. Clear outward focus. Their members intentionally know non-believers. They provide evangelism training. Their budget reflects dollars spent to start new ministries and expand services.

4. They have a strong core group, but they also equip and invite others to serve. Long-term members are still critical to the work of the church, but they open the door for new members to serve as well. These churches genuinely work on setting up the next generation to lead the church into the future.

5. Shareable Church Communication That Inspires and Informs. Too many churches do a bad job of communicating past Sunday morning. A church that is healthy and growing communicates constantly in a variety of ways.

## Capital Improvement Campaign Update

Sisters and Brothers -

As you are all well aware by now, the first week of Lent kicked off our 2019 capital improvement campaign, which we have titled "CLC - A New Vision For Service." The campaign's primary intended commitment period will continue to run thru Easter Sunday - that said, there is no hard "cutoff point." If you have not yet committed by Easter Sunday, we will continue to accept commitments after that date!

The primary time and place for obtaining more information about exactly what we're hoping to accomplish - what projects we're planning, and what amounts we're hoping to raise - will be in the small group sessions being held on Wednesday nights throughout Lent (ending on Holy Week), as well as after worship on two Sundays. # GEARING UP FOR CONTEMPORARY WORSHIP

We're hoping to launch our new contemporary worship service on Saturday, September 7<sup>th</sup>, at 5:00 on Rally Day weekend.

Contemporary worship requires a few basics:



- A reliable group of musicians: keyboard(s), guitar, bass guitar, and drums at a bare minimum.
- An engaging worship format.
- Some method for visually displaying the lyrics of songs. Younger generations want to look up and sing without a bulletin or hymnal in hand.

After much hard work, we've found a group of reliable, excellent musicians, both from within and outside the congregation. Just like paying an organist, we will need to pay musicians who come to us from outside the congregation. In today's congregations, this is routine. Contemporary musicians work just as hard to perfect their art as do organists and other traditional church musicians. It's a new day!

We're also well on the way to completing an engaging worship format that is upbeat and uplifting. Although Heart and Soul was a beautiful worship service, it clearly did not attract the new worshippers we were looking for nor did it attract younger folks. We also will try our new worship opportunity at 5:00 on Saturday.

**Finally, every congregation that has a contemporary worship service has some way to visually display lyrics.** There are two choices: a large screen or television monitors.

After much research and discussion by your Congregational Council and others, inside and outside CLC, we are recommending television monitors. A large screen or screens would negatively impact the beauty of the altar.

Television monitors, attached to the pillars, will allow provide easy and comfortable viewing and, when not in use, lay flat against the walls.

In addition to their use during the contemporary service, we can televise announcements, run video of youth events and congregational activities, and display images and graphics during sermons.

Graciously, Eric Stennett and Beth Rios are donating the Television monitors and all necessary supporting technology!

# Walk in the Woods

Randomly scanning through old computer files I discovered a poem I came across years ago. It was a poem by Sydney Lanier (1842-1881), a poet born in Macon, Georgia. <u>A Ballad of Trees and the Master</u> (1880) . . .

Into the woods my Master went, clean forespent, forespent,\*

Into the woods my Master came, forespent with love and shame. But the olives they were not blind to him, The little grey leaves were kind to him, The thorn tree had a mind to him, When into the woods he came.

Out of the woods my Master came and he was well content;

Out of the woods my Master came, content with death and shame.

When death and shame would woo him last, From under the trees they drew him last,

'Twas on a tree they slew him last when out of the woods he came.

Walking in the woods alone is a unique experience, there is no one to distract your mind, you come across things you have never seen, sounds you may never have heard, and often strange smells, pleasant or foul. In such a place it is easy to lose yourself and be lost from others. Upon your return you usually feel refreshed, renewed.

"The woods are lovely, dark and deep," Robert Frost reminds us. Dark and deep indicates to me that something mysterious is just beyond our view. Prayer is a mystery, just beyond our understanding, our private conversations with God: confession, praise, requests, questions, and responses.

The Garden of Gethsemane was and still is to this day an olive grove, a gathering of trees, the 'woods'. In such a place Christ went to pray, away from all distraction. The reader has two perspectives of The Master, outside going in and inside when he arrives, then outside when he returns. What the poet does not tell us is what happened between the coming in and going out. We do know that The Master returned content because he had received the answers he needed, he was refreshed, he was ready.

Think of prayer as going into the woods of your own mind but you will not be alone since The Master will be beside you and you will be going to meet God. What will happen there we do not know; you will return refreshed and ready with the knowledge of God's importance in your life. **Joseph Imhoff**


