THE PASTOR AS LEADER

Father Roger Schutz was one of the founders of the Taize community, whose mission was to integrate the severely handicapped into their faith community. Father Schutz died recently at the age of ninety.

As he reflected on his role, he stated, "Every human community wants to turn in on itself and be satisfied with itself as it is. The role of the leader is to never allow that to happen, but to open the community again and again to the universal purpose of God."

The worst thing a Pastor can do as the leader is what is called "going native." That is, the Pastor becomes "one of the gang" and colludes in never ruffling any feathers, and participates as the congregation turns in on itself. Although no one tends to notice because, of course, that would create anxiety, the community begins to

The Challenge of St. Luke's Cemetery

Although I am not certain of the date, CLC agreed to take over the care of St. Luke's Cemetery somewhere in the middle of Caroline and George Mendis' time as Pastors. There was around \$50,000 in a Care Fund inherited from St. Luke's Lutheran Church when it closed.

That fund has been reduced to \$2,800 at the time of this writing. Depending on the weather, it takes between \$6,000-8,000 to mow the cemetery each year. So, it's not hard to figure out that we have our backs against the wall. We will be out of money by the end of this mowing cycle.

Last year, there were eight burials at the cemetery and, for years, we have been charging a minimal amount for burial costs.

GEARING UP FOR CONTEMPORARY WORSHIP

We're hoping to launch our new contemporary worship service on Saturday, September 7th, at 6:00 on Rally Day weekend.

Contemporary worship requires a few basics:

- A reliable group of musicians: keyboard(s), guitar, bass guitar, and drums at a bare minimum.
- An engaging worship format.
- Some method for visually displaying the lyrics of songs. Younger generations want to look up and sing without a bulletin or hymnal in hand.

After much hard work, we've found a group of reliable, excellent musicians, both from within and outside the congregation. Just like paying an organist, we will need to pay musicians who come to us from outside the congregation. In today's congregations, this is routine. Contemporary musicians work just as hard to perfect their art as do organists and other traditional church musicians. It's a new day!

We're also well on the way to completing an engaging worship format that is upbeat and uplifting. Although Heart and Soul was a beautiful worship service, it clearly did not attract the new worshippers we were looking for nor did it attract younger folks. We also will try our new worship opportunity at 5:00 on Saturday.

Finally, every congregation that has a contemporary worship service has some way to visually display lyrics. There are two choices: a large screen or television monitors.

After much research and discussion by your Congregational Council and others, inside and outside CLC, we are recommending television monitors. A large screen or screens would negatively impact the beauty of the altar.

Television monitors, attached to the pillars, will allow provide easy and comfortable viewing and, when not in use, lay flat against the walls.

In addition to their use during the contemporary service, we can televise announcements, run video of youth events and congregational activities, and display images and graphics during sermons.

CLC Council Meeting Summary May 20, 2019

- In relation to SAHMWC, Council looked at our position theologically.
 We will decline the invitation to meet with the board. Council would like to create a ministry team to find a program to replace SAHMWC.
- Pastor Scott passed out a letter from the Synod. 89 percent of the congregations in our Synod are stable or declining. 11 percent are growing based on membership and attendance.
- Treasurers' Report Everything is paid for the month. The bottom line was \$1800 more in general offering than expenses for the month, including Easter.
- Four people were nominated for the Sunday School Ministry team.
 Pat Bauer, Deb Olbert, Eric Stennett and Pat Milliken are all on board.
- Helen Schwab has decided to retire from Sunday School as of this year. A card will be sent to Helen thanking her for her service.
- We had discussed last month that we were considering partnering with Element Church to run a VBS program this summer. It was decided that we did not have enough prep time for this year and will plan for a 2020 VBS program. We will ask parents for help with the VBS and Sunday School.
- Pastor Scott updated us on the Carnival. He mentioned we should have four big events each year. Any money made should go into a fund to provide seed money for those four events.
- Sunday August 25th is open house for the Millvale Community Counseling Center, 4 to 6PM. Millvale Borough Council and Mayor have been invited. First night of counseling is September 17th (Tuesday) 4-8PM.
- Contemporary Worship time is 6:00pm, Saturday, September 7.
 We will have 4 guitars, 2 drummers, 1 bass player, percussionist, a gospel organist and perhaps a horn section.
- Steve Slepecki is continuing work flow on the capital campaign.
 The most recent pledges were about \$4,000.
- Bud Worst gave an update on the cemetery, and we will probably
 use the Synod lawyers to help with making the cemetery it's own
 501c3. There are still plots available. Upkeep is about \$1000 per
 month and runs April to October/November. Bud said we have the
 opportunity of perpetual care. We can start opening this up if
 there is more money being requested for perpetual care.
- Each week Shareen Jordan has been recording the gospel, sermon and song and streaming them live on Facebook as a video. Shareen learned that random people were watching. As a council, we should have everyone share it out.

CLC Council Meeting Summary June 17, 2019

- Pastor Scott led devotions emphasizing the importance of having a vision, planning, and using our imagination to best prepare for the future of CLC.
- Pastor Scott, Steve Slepecki and Paul Bell attended the Synod Assembly and learned that the Assistant to the Bishop, Sarah Faulkner had resigned and taken a new position in Irwin.
- The Synod is also exploring ways to deal with their own financial hardship.
- Our Sunday School is now under the leadership of our new Christian Education Team with Deb Olbert, Eric Stennett, Pat Bauer and Pat Milligan. All four have extensive backgrounds in Education and Administration. They are exploring curriculums and finding ways to grow our Sunday School and retain the students we have enrolled.
- The Capital Campaign is now over \$60,000 pledged with the goal still \$225,000.
- The August 3, 2019 Carnival Team headed by Mandy Freiss will be meeting June 19. Everyone is very excited. We are currently recruiting volunteers to work the event.
- We are exploring a grant for a mural on the wall across the street to brighten up the neighborhood and inspire those in the community who are in need.
- Our Church Cemetery was discussed and we are exploring ways to help better finance the maintenance and insurance costs.
- The air conditioning installation was discussed and Dave Platt is meeting with the company we selected on Wednesday to move forward with the installation process.
