

(CHURCH) HOME IMPROVEMENTS

I suspect most of us make improvements and updates to our homes. New countertops, adding a family room, updating the bathroom, replacing that old living room sofa, or purchasing a new grill.

None of us would replace countertops with the same old thing, as if the countertop style was frozen in time. We wouldn't add a family room and furnish it in a 1970s style. That new bathroom, living room sofa, or grill will not be identical to what we are replacing.

Improvements and updates are continuing at CLC.

In making preparation for *Higher Ground*, our Saturday evening contemporary service, we are extending the chancel area and removing the front pew. We'll be able to place all our musical instruments up off the floor, hide electrical cables, and provide adequate space as we return to our seats from Holy Communion.

Our narthex is woefully outdated. Today, new congregations build a narthex that more resembles a theater lobby. That new design urges folks to hang together for conversation and fellowship before and after worship. The narthex designed when CLC was built encouraged us to "get in and get out." We will do the best we can with what we have to create a warm, welcoming space as members and visitors enter CLC.

Blending old and new, Russell Lane is constructing a Welcome Center and Volunteer Center out of the front pew and modesty screen. You'll be absolutely blown away by the beauty of these "Centers."

Finally, in doing our research on contemporary services, we discovered that they all have one thing in common: lyrics to songs or hymns are projected onto a screen or television monitor. Eric Stennett and Beth Rios graciously have donated four television monitors which will be installed before we begin *Higher Ground* on Saturday, September 8th at 5:00. As we become comfortable with their use, we will eventually use the monitors to enhance sermons, announcements, and to visually show you the impact of our various ministries.

Improvements and updates are a natural and normal part of caring for homes and our home congregation. In doing so, we create better ways to invite friends into our homes and church home.



PARENTS, KIDS, CLC KIDS, AND WORSHIP

Parents! Time for a little check-in at the mirror: If your goal is to be faithful to your baptismal promises and raise your children in the Christian faith, just dropping them off for education does not work.

What you do is more important than what you say.

Higher Ground

The initial success of *Higher Ground*, *our 5PM*Saturday Contemporary Worship, is largely dependent on the members of CLC. So how can you help?

- **1. Consider worshipping at** *Higher Ground* for the first two months. Attend on Saturday evening. Attend both Saturday evening and Sunday morning.
- **2.** Invite people in your relationship circle to check it out. Even in this day of social media, most people visit a church because they have been invited.
- **3. Share** *Higher Ground* **posts** on social media with your FB friends.
- 4. When you attend, keep your focus on new faces. Visitors return because there have made three connections: you introducing yourself, shaking hands, inviting them to check out the Welcome Place (soon to be up-and-running in the narthex), asking if they have any questions about the service, the congregation, our approach to the faith, and inviting them back after the service has concluded. The Christian faith is relational. Your welcome to the stranger makes all the difference.
- 5. Pray that *Higher Ground* will serve to further the Kingdom of God in Millvale.

GEARING UP FOR CONTEMPORARY WORSHIP

We will launch our new contemporary worship service on Saturday, September 7th, at 5:00 on Rally Day weekend.



Contemporary worship requires a few basics:

- A reliable group of musicians: keyboard(s), guitar, bass guitar, and drums at a bare minimum.
- An engaging worship format.
- Some method for visually displaying the lyrics of songs. Younger generations want to look up and sing without a bulletin or hymnal in hand.

After much hard work, we've found a group of reliable, excellent musicians, both from within and outside the congregation. Just like paying an organist, we will need to pay musicians who come to us from outside the congregation. In today's congregations, this is routine. Contemporary musicians work just as hard to perfect their art as do organists and other traditional church musicians. It's a new day!

We're also well on the way to completing an engaging worship format that is upbeat and uplifting. Although Heart and Soul was a beautiful worship service, it clearly did not attract the new worshippers we were looking for nor did it attract younger folks. We also will try our new worship opportunity at 5:00 on Saturday.

Finally, every congregation that has a contemporary worship service has some way to visually display lyrics. There are two choices: a large screen or television monitors.

After much research and discussion by your Congregational Council and others, inside and outside CLC, we are recommending television monitors. A large screen or screens would negatively impact the beauty of the altar.

Television monitors, attached to the pillars, will allow provide easy and comfortable viewing and, when not in use, lay flat against the walls.

In addition to their use during the contemporary service, we can televise announcements, run video of youth events and congregational activities, and display images and graphics during sermons.

Graciously, Eric Stennett and Beth Rios have donated the Television monitors and all necessary supporting technology!

Today, there is not one product we buy or participation in an activity that does not have some warning associated with it. 'This packaging is not a toy', 'Misuse of this product can cause:', 'The side effects of this medication are:', 'Use this apparatus with caution', 'Swim at your own risk', 'Keep away from children under' *! The list is endless and growing. Lesson: Living is dangerous!

The 10:00 Sunday adult group studied Martin Luther's Small Catechism during the 2018-2019 meetings. Bishop Elizabeth Eaton had declared 2017 as a year to study this towering document of faith for the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation.

Expecting a church-wide guide which did not materialize, the group opted for Conversations with Martin Luther's Small Catechism in the fall. Tied to the chapter on Baptism was the section concerning Confession, a very important but misunderstood tenet of the Christian faith. The section was rather short as it is in the Catechism but it elicited much discussion among those present.

Many remembered and could still recite the congregation prayer from 'The Order for Public Confession' found in the old red <u>Service Book and Hymnal</u>. Basically unchanged from the 1917 <u>Common Service Book with Hymnal</u> through the latest <u>Lutheran Worship</u>, it was used prior to Communion when the Sacrament was celebrated only a few times during the year. It remains a powerful expression of faith.

Almighty God to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hid, cleanse the the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit that we may perfectly love thee, and worthily magnify thy holy Name; through Jesus Christ, thy Son, our Lord. Amen.

Luther firmly believed in both public and private confession often to excess in his earlier years according to his Vicar General and confessor Johann von Staupitz who observed "He (Luther) was making religion too difficult!"

Each Sunday except for certain festivals the service begins with a shortened version for public confession with the presiding pastor announcing "In the name of Jesus Christ, your sins are forgiven." The true gift of God!

Private confession and confessors among Lutherans is indeed rare but that office at CLC has been assumed by Pastor Scott, in the role of therapist he, as confessor, can not only declare the forgive sins as a 'minister of the Church of God and by his authority' but help someone work through whatever difficulties that person may have.

What the class found interesting was the caveat no longer appearing in the liturgy but part of the older editions.

On the other hand, by the same authority, I declare unto the impenitent and unbelieving, that so long as they continue in their impenitence, God has not forgiven their sins and will assuredly visit their iniquities upon them if they turn not from their evil ways, and come to repentance and faith in Christ, ere the day of grace be ended. Enough to scare the you-know-what out of a believer. A warning label not to be taken lightly!
