


For each of us, the eight stages of life present us with challenges, obstacles, opportunities, and grace-filled moments that strengthen us and/or limits us.

STILL PLUGGING AWAY

So yes, The Gathering Place (former Social Hall) is taking longer than we had hoped to remodel. The old ceiling was a bear to demolish—each well-glued ceiling tile had to be chipped off by hand, which put us way behind from the start. Delays on decisions about air conditioning, electrical, and other issues pushed back the completion date.

Taping and mudding of drywall is being completed as I write and painting is right behind that. The installation of audio and sound capabilities is scheduled for late October. So, our hope is that The Gathering Place is functional by the November Neighborhood Table event. There will still be more work to be done, but "functional" is the key word! Thank you for your patience.

For the ends of Being and ideal Grace.'

These two could be a dialogue between a couple in love or looking to the future, but that's the conjecture term papers and dissertations are based on.

Pippa is a young girl in a town called Osolo who works in a silk mill 364 days a year and has one holiday, New Years Day, I won't delve into the child labor laws of poetry. Cheerfully she goes through the town singing, unseen but heard by those she passes, those she respects and thinks are the happiest in the town. The most famous follows:

> 'The year's at the spring, And day's at the morn; Morning's at seven; The hill-sides dew-pearled; The lark's on the wing; The snail's on the thorn; God's in his heaven—All's right with the world!'

The respectable people who hear her song though have secrets, among them are murder, infidelity, deception, intrigue, avarice. Four dramas play out during the day, Morning, Noon, Evening, and Night. Pippa is unaware of what is taking place behind closed doors, but it is her innocence in each song she sings causes reactions in the unhappy 'happy' people! She is acting as each one's conscience. Her words cause every one of them to contemplate their lives and their actions, in turn each makes a decision for a change in life.

The last line of Pippa's first song is usually taken out of context because it has a nice ring to it but Christians know this is not the case. The world was created 'right', not like a mechanical clock but something to evolve and is still evolving, thus creating the situations in the poem and in the real world.

Pippa is a kind of therapist for the town of Osolo, singing a balance in a world that has lost it. I am not suggesting that Pastor Scott's singing should compare to Pippa's nor should he lash a piano on a truck to drive through Millvale spreading his advice.

It is true, however that CLC does reach out by hosting the Millvale Community Counseling Center. In the Neighborhood for Good!
