### **COUNCIL UPDATE**

The church council met on Monday, April 19, 2021. It was our first meeting with our new interim, Pastor Erin. Discussions included Earth Day, Saturday, April 24, 2021 at 9:00 a.m. to clean up the area around CLC. We hope to work with a neighborhood group to clean up St. Luke's Cemetery. Becky Nyren will be organizing the project. Please contact her, if you would like to help. We also discussed grass cutting at CLC and are looking for volunteers to cut grass. A retreat is scheduled for May for the council to work on the calendar and goals for CLC.

Or if a member prefers, they can send a written letter to the panel. The process should take about two weeks once they have started. ### From the Pastor's Desk....

Dear members and friends of Christ,

It's been so great to get to finally see you all in person, after I've prayed for you for so long. We're back to in-person worship, singing with masks on, and a socially distant choir. Temps are checks, and seating is distanced. We have Holy Communion and an excellent liturgy, thanks to our talented musicians! This is where we'll start, as worship is foundational to our lives as the body of Christ.

## When we are gathered by the Holy Spirit and fed by the sacrament, we are strengthened to care for each other and serve our neighbor.

Caring for each other will involve listening and praying and attending to the basic practices of community. I'll be visiting all the shut-ins and the sick. I'll be meeting with council members and hosting small listening sessions in order to meet and get to know at least 60 people in 60 days. We'll be putting together an updated directory and sending out a newsletter mailing to those without email. We'll get back to the things we do to serve the church like volunteering our time and preparing for worship. We'll celebrate the Affirmation of Baptism of some of our young members, and we'll plan for Christian Education and some informal worship options for the summer.

I know it has been a year of great upheaval and uncertainty. Some in our community may need to catch their breath before figuring out how to reengage, while others are chomping at the bit to keep moving forward. We'll need to be patient with each other and listen carefully to each other as we journey together.

I'm excited to resume/reimagine all the ways that Christ Lutheran has been a faithful and hopeful presence in the community of Millvale. Our food bank is still going strong, and I'll be meeting with Anchorpoint Counseling Ministry to talk about hosting them again.

It is still our plan to continue to offer online worshipping opportunities for those who are unable to resume in-person worship as this time. Please take advantage of that and let me know if you desire Holy Communion.



The image of the good shepherd shows us how the risen Christ brings us to life. It is the relationship between the shepherd and the sheep, one of mutual knowledge and love, that gives the shepherd authority. The shepherd's willingness to lay down his life for the sheep shows his love. First John illustrates what it means to lay down our lives for one another by the example of sharing our wealth with any sibling in need.

### Third Sunday (Fourth Sunday of Easter)

Noise is hard on the ears, OSHA requires many industries to supply ear plugs, earmuffs, or noise cancelling head gear for hearing protection on the job. Noisy people can be a nuisance and often considered obnoxious. But, the unnamed psalmist of Psalm 66 exhorts us to, "Make a joyful noise to God, all the earth; sing the glory of his name; give to him glorious praise."

Jubilate Sunday comes from the Latin Introit: "Iubilate Deo, omnis terra, alleluia: psalmum dicite nomini eius." The Psalm is very joyous, many of the verses extol the wonderful things God has done for his chosen people. The appointed lessons for the day temper the final joy with the reality of a world unaccepting of God's great gift. In these selections we are shown those things which have happened or may happen, that when God acts, our joy is only natural.

In the present day lectionary for the Fourth Sunday of Easter all three cycles of lessons focus on Christ the Good Shepherd.
