




Gospel: As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you;



## Eternal, Unconditional, and Unchanging

To abide is to put down roots: to dwell in the same location and with the same people for the long term. Unlike in Jesus' time, today few of us live in the same place in which we were born. Families are routinely scattered across the country and around the world. Yet Jesus invites us, "Abide in my love" (John 15:9). While so much else in our lives seems impermanent, Jesus' love is eternal, unconditional, and unchanging. The secret to love is that it puts others first. Love is the only emotion that can defeat our instinctive self-centeredness. Jesus issues an invitation to be awake and aware, to see others as beloved children of God.

# Fifth Sunday + (Sixth Sunday After Easter) Joseph Imhoff

Rogate, the Latin name for this Sunday is not to be found in the traditional Introit for the day which is taken from Isaiah 48:20, "[Go forth from Babylon! Flee from the Chaldeans!] With a voice of singing, Declare, proclaim this, Utter it to the end of the earth; Say, 'The Lord has redeemed His servant Jacob!'" It is a thanksgiving for the answer to prayers and God's gifts.

Rogate is the imperative present (command, direction) tense of the verb rogare (rogo, rogare, rogavi, rogatum) which means to ask. Lessons for the day include: "Seek the Lord while he may be found, call upon him while he is near," and "If you ask anything of the Father in my name he will give it to you."

These words are significant because Wednesday of this week is Ascension Day, forty days after Easter. Our Lord is still with us as He has not ascended to the Father. Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday are considered rogation days, days set aside for petitioning God for His blessings, at this time of year that is for the planted crops to be fruitful, the Church is to be fruitful with the coming of the Holy Spirit. Today's Lutheran Church maintains the sense of rogation in Occasional Services under The Stewardship of Creation.
