

CHANGE TO COVID RESTRICTIONS

As more of our population has had the chance to be vaccinated, and many places are permitting vaccinated people to remove masks, things are changing here at CLC again. We've lived through a year of great upheaval and quick changes, and consistently we have made choices to protect the most vulnerable populations during this global pandemic.

The CLC Congregational Council has **voted to remove the "mask mandate" for vaccinated persons during public worship,** and open pews that had been closed due to social distancing. Those who are not vaccinated are asked to continue wearing a mask.

For those who consider themselves to be still at risk, and may yet be wary of coming to in-person worship, we offer "Safer Seating." This is a section of socially distanced seating at the back of the church where masks are required. This section is labelled as such. Anyone may sit there, so long as they are masked and distanced. As always, we appreciate your patience and flexibility, and we look forward to this new change and step forward.

TAIZE PRAYER

Taizé Prayer is evening prayer for all Christian faiths. It is a simple, meditative form of worship, calling us to dwell deeply on Christ's presence around and within us. Repeated melodies and refrains, prayerful silence, and short readings guide the focus of the prayer in a candle-lit environment.

Which Kingdom? Amid the dancing, feasting, and complicated family dynamics of this week's gospel text, we hear a story of two leaders who embody power very differently: John, a man of righteousness and integrity, and Herod, whose power is corrupted by fear, greed, and paranoia. The former embodies the kind of power that points us to life and wholeness. The latter kind of power results in gruesome and irrational death.

All too often, corruption and greed seem to win the day. We might find ourselves desperately searching for Christ and wondering if there is any hope to be salvaged from the wreckage of grief, anxiety, and pain present in our world.

The good news is that the story of God doesn't end in senseless violence at the hands of power-hungry rulers. There is another banquet to come. This banquet will be a celebration in which the wealthy and powerful are not front and center. It will be a feast where Jesus is the host and there is more than enough for everyone to eat their fill. It is a banquet of new life, hope, and a kind of power that empties itself for the sake of the other. ~

Quo Vadimus?

Six years ago I wrote companion articles, "Quo Vadis?" and "Quo Vadimus?" for the newsletter. It was a time of transition and of decisions, much like today. The idea came from the popular movie of 1951 and the book on which it was based. In a late chapter St. Peter flees Rome ruled by Nero Pontifex Maximus. As his journey proceeded he had a vision of Jesus and kneeling down asked in Latin, "Quo vadis, Domine? (Where are you going, Lord?)". "Romam vado iterum crucifigi!", Jesus answered, (I am going to Rome to be crucified again!". These are real quotes from the Apocryphal book <u>The Acts of Peter</u>.
