

With a Voice of Singing Joseph Imhoff

Earlier this year Living Lutheran ran an issue with articles under the banner "Music & Faith" reminding me how much Lutherans are renowned for their singing and their hymns. The editor in "Editor's Note" column used the term, the gift of music; indeed it is, God's gift to the Church. Her husband, obviously not a Lutheran said, "You Lutherans like to sing a lot." She replied, "Yes, we do."

The Church has always sung from the Old Testament on, Moses, Miriam, Hannah, a whole collection in The Book of Psalms, and into the New with Mary, many we still sing today with more modern music. Before modern sound equipment other than a megaphone chanting was used so the words would carry in a great space. Martin Luther loved to sing, they say he was a good tenor, and during the time of the Reformation he didn't do away with the singing, chanting, but wrote hymns for the congregation to sing, what a radical idea. They were teaching tools with the lessons of the Church taught to illiterate people who would remember them in the song, not as the spoken word. Some even are much like sermons, Dear Christians, One and All' (229 LBW), no offense to the clergy when that is the hymn of the day.

What most people missed during the pandemic was the singing, either by a choir or as a congregation, no matter what was tried via remote services it wasn't the same, something was missing. Hymns are a congregational endeavor. John Wesley in Select Hymns (1761), many of which his brother Charles had written, gave directions to the congregation. All should join in the singing in spite of perceived ability. Sing lustily with courage and strength without shame. Do not try to out-sing others but join in as one voice.

Then there is the choir, that group hiding in the loft as their 'safe' space. They are the mainstay holding the musical portions of the service together, leading the singing of hymns for the congregation, especially unfamiliar ones, leading liturgical responses to the chanting of the cantor or presiding clergy, and providing additional music during the service. They are not there for the entertainment of the congregation but to LEAD them.

On Thursday, September 9, at 7:00 PM the Choir will resume practicing. Everyone who can sing, or thinks they can, is most welcome to come, there are no tryouts. It isn't as hard as you might think, well, sometimes, but it is also fun and good Christian fellowship. Everyone is welcome regardless of ability.

James tells us to stop showing favoritism in the assembly, treating the rich visitor with more honor than the poor one. Peter Claver, priest, missionary to Colombia, died 1654 Thursday, September 9, 2021

Born into Spanish nobility, Claver became a Jesuit missionary, and served in present-day Colombia. His ministry was focused on the slaves that arrived there. He gave them food and medicine, learned their dialects, and taught them Christianity.
