





The third season of the Church year is closing, Advent, Christmas, Epiphany; Epiphany as you remember is the 'aha moment' when something is revealed, over the past seven Sundays it has been the revelations of who Jesus is, the acknowledgement by the Magi, his baptism by John, the wedding at Cana, there are so many more.


This Sunday is one of the greatest of those moments, witnessed by only a few, Peter, James and John; Jesus goes up a mountain and becomes 'radiant in the glory'. Not only does he shine with bright rays of light, he enters into conversation with Moses representing the Law and Elijah the Prophets. Moses had died and was buried never entering the Promised Land because he and Aaron had not trusted God at Meribah. Elijah had been 'taken up into heaven' in front of Elisha, his successor. Both were now alive in the presence of the Son of God indicating this is possible for all who have faith.

This is the time and place that human nature meets God, the temporal and the eternal, Jesus himself being the bridge between heaven and earth.

Upcoming Commemorations

George Herbert, hymnwriter, died 1633 Tuesday, March 1, 2022

An excellent scholar, Herbert served briefly in the English parliament, then became a parish priest. He was known for devoted care of his parishioners, as well as for writing poetry and hymns, including "Come, my way, my truth, my life." He died at age 40.

John Wesley, died 1791; Charles Wesley, died 1788; renewers of the church Wednesday, March 2, 2022

These brothers led a revival originally intended to remain within the Church of England, one that involved frequent communion and advocacy for the poor. Except for a brief time in America, they worked in England. Charles was also a prolific hymn writer. After their deaths, their work led to the formation of the Methodist Church.
