

CLC COUNCIL NOTES

In the spirit of transparency, it is my intent to periodically write a short series of notes from Church Council, what we are working on and planning. Also, to provide some information about what is happening at CLC.

This past Monday, May the 9th, Church Council had its monthly meeting. Pastor Peter Asplin, Assistant to the Bishop, was our guest. He came to talk to us about starting a call process. This is the first step in the process. We had good conversations, talking about the history of the Church and its ministry to the community. Our first goal is to discuss as a council the questions regarding the Church's "ministry site profile" (MSP), and then extending those questions to the congregation. By answering these questions, we will be able to tell a story of who we are, what our mission is and what our goals for the future are, along with providing information to any Pastor who may be interested in taking a call here at Christ Lutheran.

When Council feels they are ready to put together a Call Committee, Pastor Asplin will walk us through the process. If you are interested in being part of this process in any way let me or anyone on Council know.

Κύριε, ἐλέησον **Kyrie Eleison**

Got your attention! I thought it might. Of course, it's Greek to me and to you and to anyone else who looks at it, even to someone from Greece which is $E\lambda\lambda\delta\delta\alpha$, Elláda, Hellenic Republic in the language! Why we call it Greece is a long story in itself dealing with settlers in southern Italy and the Latin language.

As has been announced this Sunday a new setting for the service will be introduced, the format remains the same but there changes in some wording and different music. The music is more contemporary but catchy, even toe tapping! The choir has been working on it for the past few weeks and is enthusiastic, some members finding it familiar possibly one of settings from Contemporary Worship that preceded the introduction of the Lutheran Book of Worship, the green hymnal you find in the pews.

It is quite appropriate to introduce Setting Eight that appears in the latest hymnal, Evangelical Lutheran Worship, on this day as it was once designated Cantate Sunday, "Sing to the Lord a new song, for he has done marvelous things!" We have a NEW SONG to sing!

Which brings me to Κύριε ἐλέησόν, Kyrie Eleison, Lord, have mercy, this is the beginning of every Sunday service after the Confession and entry hymn and sung or read before the Hymn of Praise, now "This is the Feast of Victory for Our God", a truly Easter announcement of the season.

Before you ask! Yes, there will be a Worship Guide for you to follow along having the outline of the service including the words and music for you to sing along even without Mitch Miller! As I already stated you should find it catchy and easy to sing, toe tapping is permitted, most of the responses have little or no changes made to what have been doing every Sunday.

Worship and Music would like any feedback you may have: good (we hope) or bad. As they say, "Try it, you'll like it!" ~

We Are Found

As Jesus in today's gospel prepares the disciples for his imminent departure, he tells them that they will look for



him but won't be able to join him where he is going. It will not be long before the women are at the tomb in the early morning, only to find it empty.

We also look for Jesus, but perhaps we don't know that we are engaged in the search. We are constantly seeking purpose and answers, turning to self-help books, inspirational videos, exercise programs, and new ways of organizing our stuff. Billboards and magazine covers highlight our flaws while offering the next best solution to make us happy and well.

These opportunities can be compelling, and some of them will prove successful in managing some aspects of life. But these solutions don't turn up what we're really looking for: to be truly loved and known, secure and whole. We find this security only in the love of God. Yet, in this Easter season we are reminded that we do not need to seek Jesus; rather, Jesus seeks out and finds us. We cannot go where Jesus goes, leading the way through death to new life, but Jesus ultimately finds us wherever we are, even when we are most lost. The women found an empty tomb, but Jesus is not gone. The resurrected Jesus finds them!

In finding us, Jesus also directs our searching by giving us a commandment: "Love one another" (John 13:34). In seeking to love one another, we are reminded again and again that the great love of God has already found us. ~

Erik, King of Sweden, martyr, died 1160 Wednesday, May 18, 2022

Erik is considered the patron saint of Sweden. As king of that nation, he tried to bring peace in the region, and to spread Christianity in Scandinavia. He was also known for his attempts to make fair laws and to protect those who were poor or sick.

Helena, mother of Constantine, died around 330 Saturday, May 21, 2022

Influenced by her son to become Christian, Helena (or Helen) lived an exemplary life of faith. She is also remembered for traveling through Palestine building churches on the sites she believed to be associated with Christ's life.


