All We Like Sheep

"All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the Lord has laid on Him the iniquity of us all." This chorus from Handel's Messiah Part II, No. 26 is an appropriate introduction to the Fourth Sunday of Easter referred to as Good Shepherd Sunday. Sheep are stupid and need to be led, prodded, in the right direction, that was the assessment of Pastor George after attending a retreat where tending sheep was one of the duties, he was not referring to the flock of CLC!

The Dialogues are Plato's homage to Socrates and The Republic is the greatest. In it a group of friends meet for dinner and discussion, much like an adult Sunday study group.

At 345c, Socrates replies to Thrasymachus' political argument comparing a ruler to a shepherd (sound familiar) as being interested only in the culinary possibilities.

"For I must remark, Thrasymachus, if you will recall what was previously said, ... a shepherd tends the sheep not with a view to their own good, but like a mere diner or banqueter with a view to the pleasures of the table. Yet surely the art of the shepherd is concerned only with the good of his subjects; he has only to provide the best for them...! I conceived that the art of the ruler... could only regard the good of his flock or subjects."

In ancient times a shepherd was a low skill (minimum wage) job just above tending swine as in the story of the Prodigal Son. The loss of a sheep might be deducted from the shepherd's wages. The art Socrates referred to is concern, the shepherd to the ruler.

I doubt Socrates or Plato were familiar with אֶחְסָר יְהוָה עי לא, David's "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want."

In John: 10, the lesson for all three cycles of the lectionary, Jesus puts forth his duties as the 'good shepherd'. "The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep." - "I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me just as the Father knows me and I know the Father." - "Whoever has seen me, has seen the Father!"

We are poor little lambs who have lost our way. Baa, baa, baa! ~



As a group corners Jesus in the portico at the time of the festival of the Dedication, they are intent on determining whether he is the Messiah. Jesus' response points to two things: the words he has spoken and the testimony of his works. Jesus' words and works are aligned, and this integrity is grounded in the unity of Jesus and the Father.

People are complicated. We have an ability to justify ourselves when our speech and our actions do not align. We have a capacity to hold together contradictory ideas, some of which can be full of love, others of which can be harmful to our neighbors. We are not sometimes good and sometimes sinful, but both at once.

How does this paradox impact our integrity and our witness? Our words and actions matter in that they affect other people. To the extent that we can put effort into aligning our speech and our deeds in faithful ways, we should do so, but ultimately it is Jesus who draws us into alignment. The voice of Jesus is like the magnetic force that brings the compass needle to point north, or like the mechanic who adjusts the alignment on a car so it will steer straight.

We will inevitably get out of alignment with our values and our faith from time to time, but the voice of the Shepherd is always there to invite us back into alignment with grace and love. As we seek to live with faithful integrity, we do so with the promise that we cannot be snatched away from God. ~

Upcoming Commemorations

Julian of Norwich, renewer of the church, died around 1416 Sunday, May 8, 2022

When she was about thirty years old, Julian (or Juliana) reported visions that she later compiled into a book, Sixteen Revelations of Divine Love, now a classic of medieval mysticism. The visions declared that love was the meaning of religious experience, provided by Christ who is love, for the purpose of love.

Victor the Moor, martyr, died 303 (TFF) Sunday, May 8, 2022

Also known as Victor Maurus, this native of the northwest African nation of Mauritania was a soldier in the Roman Praetorian Guard. Under the persecution of Maximian, Victor died for his faith at Milan.

Nicolaus Ludwig von Zinzendorf, renewer of the church, hymnwriter, died 1760

Monday, May 9, 2022

When he was 22, a group of Moravians asked permission to live on Zinzendorf's land. He agreed, and eventually worldwide Moravian missions emanated from this community. Zinzendorf participated in these missions, and is also remembered for writing hymns characteristic of his Pietistic faith.

Matthias, Apostle Saturday, May 14, 2022

Matthias was the apostle added to the Twelve after Jesus' resurrection, as a replacement for the dead Judas Iscariot. He had traveled among the followers of Jesus throughout the Lord's ministry. Formerly commemorated on February 24, Matthias's celebration is moved to May 14 in agreement with most Western calendars.
