

Tradition

As the musical Fiddler on the Roof opens Tevye, the milkman of the village, is explaining how everyone relates to everyone else, how business and social interactions are conducted: Tradition!

Tradition is what holds everything together, the glue, it keeps things stable just because it's there, otherwise life would be a shaky as a fiddler up on a roof top. 'Oy vey, such a thing should happen!

A number of years ago The Lutheran, now Living Lutheran, in one edition ran a group of interconnected articles by five contributors on that very subject and its importance to the Church.

Tradition within the Lutheran Church begins with its founding and founder Martin Luther who was not a maverick but traditional in his faith choosing not to sweep away 1500 years of Church tradition but return it to its roots, deny what was injurious to faith, affirm the good and create traditions as the Holy Spirit would guide it.

Traditions come and go depending on tastes but only up to a point. Lutherans have a guide to follow, The Book of Concord, made up from the writings of Martin Luther, those with him, containing the explanations of who we are, what we believe and why we are what we are at the beginning of The Reformation.

Important to that is instruction, Luther wrote a small and large catechism and stacks of other material to instruct we the ignorant in faith. He was appalled by what the people who called themselves Christians and went to church regularly didn't know and went about to correct it.

The other strong suit in Lutheran tradition is the liturgy we use every Sunday, inherited from the practices of those prior 1500 years, not shunted aside as was done by some reformer who preferred a total break with the Catholic Church. The words may change, we no longer speak or are familiar with King Jamesian English, and the music settings run the gamut from Gregorian style chant to exciting contemporary.

The worship and music committee is in the process of planning out the worship events for the upcoming fall, taking into consideration church-wide events and local celebrations, changes to the musical setting denoting the transition all with the boundaries of TRADITION! ~



God's Goodness Doesn't Sting

Sometimes when people are in need, they pray. And then they wait. They wonder. They wait some more, and pray some more. Is God listening? Will God answer my prayer? Some people may worry that they have done something to deafen God's ears to their needs. Maybe they fear they are unworthy to be heard and helped, or that their lives don't matter. Maybe they just give up on themselves and on God.

Jesus is well aware of the challenges of being a person of faith and trusting in God when life is tough. He invites people into a deep trust in God. Why? Because God gives us everything we want, even if it is bad for us? No! God doesn't give scorpions to sting us, even if we ask for them. Jesus invites people into a deep trust in God because of God's profound goodness. Jesus urges us to ask God for the sustenance we need: bread, fish, eggs, mercy, justice, love. God will give us such good things because God is so good.

The heart of Jesus' message is rooted in God's goodness. It is not centered on our worthiness, but on God's generous heart. God is good. God is merciful. God is compassionate. God responds to our need out of that benevolence. The Good One gives good things for those in need. This is who God is for us.

This doesn't resolve our tough and appropriate questions about when and how prayers get answered. It does tell us that we are invited to trust that we are cared for no matter what. We are provided for beyond our comprehension, not because of our goodness, but because of God's. We can come forward to Christ's table—hungry for acceptance, longing for the bread of mercy—and know we will receive that bread in our hands. ~

Upcoming Commemorations

James, Apostle

Monday, July 25, 2022

James and his brother John were the sons of Zebedee, fishermen by trade before their call from Jesus. He was the first of the twelve apostles to be martyred, and his death is the only one recorded in scripture (Acts 12:1-2).

Johann Sebastian Bach, died 1750; Heinrich Schütz, died 1672; George Frederick Handel, died 1759; musicians

Thursday, July 28, 2022

These three German-born musicians have done much to enrich the life of the church. Schütz was an early master who focused on settings of biblical texts. Bach wrote over 300 cantatas along with works for organ and instrumental pieces, and has been called the "fifth evangelist" for the way he proclaimed the gospel in music. Handel's great work, Messiah, is a setting of scriptural texts.

Mary, Martha, and Lazarus of Bethany Friday, July 29, 2022

Friends of Jesus, Mary and Martha are remembered for the hospitality of their home that they offered him—Martha focused on serving their guest, and Mary on listening to him. Their brother Lazarus was raised from the dead as a sign of the greater resurrection to come.

Olaf, King of Norway, martyr, died 1030 Friday, July 29, 2022

Considered the patron saint of Norway, Olaf went from a life of piracy to becoming Christian and declaring himself king of Norway. He revised the laws and tried to administer them fairly. Driven from Norway in a rebellion, he was killed in battle trying to regain his kingdom.


