

We all know that summer worship attendance takes a dip while we all enjoy the great outdoors(or air conditioned bliss!), but can we talk about our summer offerings and tithes?



Our Hands

Going over the Church calendar of upcoming events I came across one that is unique to the Evangelical Lutheran Church in American, "God's Work, Our Hands", an annual day of service. That got me started on thinking about what we do with our hands, just about everything, we use them for work, for play almost action we take, some people use their hands when they talk! We take them for granted until we see someone who has lost a hand or arm and wonder what it feels like; protheses have come a long way in that regard but not quite to the level of ones provided to Luke Skywalker or Darth Vader in the movies.

How does this fit into God's Work? God is at work, and Jesus embodies what God is working on-the new creation. As members of the community of believers the Holy Spirit works through us and through our hands. We do God's work, not because God needs us to do so but because our neighbor does!

"Let the favor of the Lord our God be upon us, and establish the work of our hands upon us; yes, establish the work of our hands!" (Psalm 90:17)

This year "God's Work, Our Hands" is scheduled for Sunday September 11, though individual congregations my choose a different Sunday if need be. It is interesting to note that on the home page of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America directly under the name is the phrase, "God's Work, Our Hands". The purpose is to celebrate who we are as the ELCA-one church, freed in Christ to love and serve our neighbor.

Though CLC will be celebrating Rally Day for the Sunday school on that day, the spirit of "God's Work, Our Hands" is very much a part of this congregation with "In the Neighborhood for Good"! ~



A Division That Brings Peace

Today's word is difficult to hear, but all too obvious at the same time. The message of God's governance among us, which lifts up the lowly and challenges the mighty, brings division. The good news brings division because some welcome it with exuberant joy, since it is the only good news they hear, and some resist it because it is a profound challenge to human assumptions about God, the world, and us.

We might be surprised to hear Jesus say he has not come to bring peace, but division. This is because he insists on a gospel of peace for everyone, not just a few. The division Jesus speaks of is not the goal, but it is the inevitable outcome of insisting that everyone is included in God's family. Division and conflict are the price he is willing to pay if that's what it takes to usher in a world of true peace rooted in God's mercy. Jesus paid that price when he was crucified for his faithfulness to God's welcoming way.

The church continues the ministry of Jesus when it enters into the fray of lifting up people the world deems unwelcome or lowly. Who is excluded or marginalized in your community? Why is this so? Does your church mirror this exclusion and marginalization, or does it transcend it with a welcome to those very persons left out elsewhere? What division has this faithfulness to the gospel caused?

The most wonderful witness the church gives, and the most divisive thing it does, is declare forgiveness to every repentant heart in Christ's name: the excluded and the exclusive, the lowly and the mighty. The most beautiful inbreaking of the governance of God is when humble persons gather around Christ's table, open their hands to receive bread and wine, and deeply embrace their own welcome and their neighbor's welcome at the very same table. In that sacramental moment, the peace that led to division turns into complete peace. ~

Upcoming Commemorations

Maximilian Kolbe, died 1941; Kaj Munk, died 1944; martyrs Sunday, August 14, 2022

Father Kolbe was a Franciscan priest arrested by the Nazis and confined in Auschwitz. Kolbe gave generously of his meager resources, and finally volunteered to be starved to death in place of another man. A Danish Lutheran pastor and playwright, Munk strongly denounced the Nazis who occupied Denmark in the Second World War. His sermons and articles helped to show the anti-Christian nature of the movement.

Mary, Mother of Our Lord Monday, August 15, 2022

The church (including Martin Luther) honored Mary with the title theotokos, meaning "God-bearer," for her role in giving birth to the Son of God. Her song, the Magnificat, speaks eloquently of God's lifting the lowly and feeding the hungry.

Bernard, Abbot of Clairvaux, died 1153 Saturday, August 20, 2022

Bernard, a Cistercian monk, was a man of great spirituality who wrote mystical works and criticized those whom he thought took an overly intellectual approach to the faith. He became an abbot, and wrote several hymns that are still beloved today.


