

A New Covenant

ברוך אתה ה' אלהינו מלך העולם, שהכל ברא לכבו

Transliteration: Barukh ata Adonai Eloheinu melekh hallolam shehakol bara lichvodo. "Blessed are You, LORD, our God, sovereign of the universe, who created everything for His Glory." This is a Talmudic prayer alluding to the fact that every person and thing has a place in God's universe. It is most often associated with the covenant of marriage in the Jewish ceremony.

As you have heard from Lenny Jansen on a Sunday morning and will hear from others in the future the church council wrestled with the idea of how to show its commitment to the future of Christ Lutheran Church in Millvale honoring the slogan "In the Neighborhood for Good".

To that end on the advice of Dr. Graham Standish, a professional who assists congregations in times of transition, the council created its own covenant as a way of defining its place and responsibility within CLC. The idea of covenants is very Biblical in nature, often accompanied by animal sacrifice and burnt offerings, none of which the council endeavored.

The tradition of the covenant continues when we hear the term to make one's bar mitzvah or bat mitzvah, we think that it is similar to what we call confirmation but within the Hebrew tradition! "Today I am a man or woman!" is the usual phrase. Yes and no! Bar means son, bat means daughter, Simon bar Jonah was Simon son of John, Peter the Apostle.

Bar mitzvah, son of the Covenant; bat mitzvah, daughter of the Covenant. It is a pledge to God, Adonai, יהוה, YHWH, a word, a name, too sacred to utter. We are heirs of that tradition, children of the Covenant, the New Covenant.

"A new Commandment I give unto you, that you love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another. By this shall all men know that ye are my disciples, if ye have love one to another."

This is the new Covenant, the last Mitzvah, sealed by Jesus Christ, Son of the living God. It binds all who believe to him, not by fear, but in love.

Security Systems That Don't Fail

Jesus knows that we worry about a lot of things. Many people who own a lot of possessions live in fear of losing them. Some find that a security system installed with cameras and sensors and smart doorbells can lower their anxiety. But even with internet-of-things technology, these security systems do not stop the risk of theft. We may get a video of someone stealing our stuff, but we still lose the stuff. Anxiety over losing what we have persists and may in fact be ever-present as our cell phones alert us to each passerby at the front door.

Jesus proposes several other security systems that transform our anxiety over losing what we have into a different kind of calm. The first one he offers is probably the least popular: Sell your possessions and give the money to the poor. You don't have to worry about your belongings being stolen if you get rid of them. It's a radical option, but an option nonetheless.

Jesus also proposes another kind of security: Place value in the things that can't be stolen. When we treasure the mercy and love of God as our most prized possession, we have what no one else can take. We have a security system that does not fail. We have deep and abiding peace. Our fears are calmed.

There is one additional security system to which Jesus invites us: Have confidence that it is God's good pleasure to give us life with God, life in a world where everyone has enough and no one worries about losing it, life where we all know we are equally beloved. When this is our treasure, when it is where we place our hearts, we find the peace that is a secure gift. ~

Upcoming Commemorations

Dominic, founder of the Order of Preachers (Dominicans), died 1221 Monday, August 8, 2022

Dominic was a Spanish priest who saw the wealth of the clergy as a stumbling block for the church, so he formed a movement, the Order of Preachers (commonly called Dominicans) devoted to itinerant preaching and living in poverty.

Lawrence, deacon, martyr, died 258 Wednesday, August 10, 2022

As one of the seven deacons of the church at Rome, Lawrence was responsible for the church's financial matters and for the care of the poor. Asked by the emperor to gather the church's treasure, he presented a collection of orphans, lepers, and the like. The enraged emperor had him put to death.

Clare, Abbess of San Damiano, died 1253 Thursday, August 11, 2022

A contemporary of Francis of Assisi, Clare and a growing number of companions established a women's Franciscan community, called the Order of Poor Ladies, or Poor Clares. She inspired other women to pursue spiritual goals.

Florence Nightingale, died 1910; Clara Maass, died 1901; renewers of society Saturday, August 13, 2022

Nightingale was born in England, and horrified her wealthy family by deciding to become a nurse. She led a group of nurses in ministering in the midst of the Crimean War, and worked for hospital reform. Maass, a native of New Jersey, was also a war nurse, and volunteered as a subject for research on yellow fever. She died of the disease.


