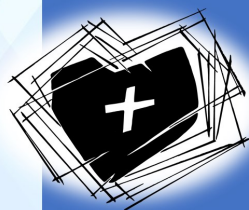

Pastor Tom Stennett, residing in Aspinwall, formerly of Shaler, entered life eternal August 22nd, 2022, surrounded by loved ones. He was born April 2, 1933, and married his wife, Judith, on August 20, 1960. He was preceded in death by his parents, Edgar and Sarah, his brother Alan, and his great grandson Julian. He is survived by his two siblings, Jack, and Marlene; three children, Beth (Joseph), Matthew (Marianne) and Eric; six grandchildren Angela (Zach), Michael (Kimberly), Allison (John), Hannah, Alex, and Jillian; and seven great-grandchildren, Dorian, Elias, Sophia, Oliver, Annabelle, Jackson, and Abigail.

Tom is remembered as a wonderful Father, Grandfather and Great-Grandfather who always put family first. Teach Us to Pray 3

The continuation of Martin Luther's instructions to his barber, Peter.

6. Now when the heart is aroused and has come to itself through such admonitions, kneel or stand with folded hands, look toward heaven, and think or say as briefly as you can: O heavenly Father, blessed God, I am a poor, forlorn sinner. I am not worthy to lift up my hands and eyes to you in prayer. But you have commanded us all to pray and have promised to hear us. You have taught us the words and the way to pray. Therefore, obedient to your command, and relying on your gracious promise, I come in the name Lord Jesus Christ and pray with all your holy Christians on earth, as he has taught us to pray: (Here is recited the Lord's Prayer).

After this, repeat a part or as much as you desire, beginning with the First Petition:

What follows at this point is each separate petition after the introductory, "Our Father who art in heaven.", then from one to three prayers based on that particular petition.

But Luther is by no means finished with his instruction: If I have the time and strength before the Lord's Prayer, I meditate on the Ten Commandments in a similar manner. Thus I take one after another, so that as far as possible I may be altogether free to pray each one. "I ask for help and strength to become devout and to keep your commandments. Amen."

And for good measure: He who still has time and inclination may do likewise with the Creed (Apostles'), making a four-strand wreath of it.

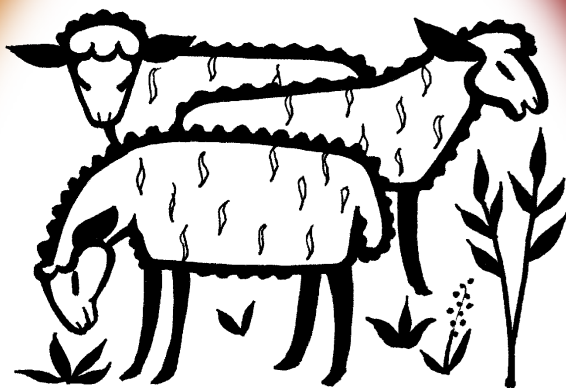
As you can see, Martin Luther was very serious in his teaching about prayer and its aspects remarking concerning the Lord's Prayer: It is a great pity that such a prayer of such a master should be chattered and babbled in all the world without devotion. Many perhaps pray a thousand Pater Nosters a year....they would still not have tasted or prayed one jot or tittle of it. For everybody grieves and abuses it, and few cheer and gladden it by rightly using it.

Peripheral Vision

“Look straight forward and raise your hand on the side where you see the blinking light in the corner of your eye.” Maybe you have taken a peripheral-vision test at an optometrist’s office or at a DMV while renewing your driver’s license. Peripheral vision, like peripheral hearing and other sensory parallels, is the ability to perceive things that occur outside the center of one’s focus.

In today’s gospel, Jesus tells a story about a shepherd who seems to have good peripheral senses. He loses one sheep out of a hundred and immediately notices and sets off to look for it. This story may be so familiar that it is easy to take his actions for granted. But should we? It seems that many people looking at such a large group of nearly identical animals would have a difficult time noticing the disappearance of just one.

Yet this is precisely what Jesus does throughout his ministry. He is always noticing people on the margins of society whom others don’t see—whether because of disease, profession, gender, economic status, or past wrongs. Again and again he is criticized by other religious leaders for moving beyond the people they are focused on and toward others they see as peripheral. As Jesus’ followers, we are called to let him shift our attention to people who need the love and attention of God—even when it takes us beyond the comfort of our normal focus.

Today, as you gather to worship, ask yourself: Who is missing from the picture? Who is at the periphery of your assembly? Who is Jesus inviting to this table? In your church, in your community, in your neighborhood, or in your work, who does Jesus see that you have missed, and what would it look like to seek after them? ~

Upcoming Commemorations

John Chrysostom, Bishop of Constantinople, died 407

Tuesday, September 13, 2022

John was a priest in Antioch and an outstanding preacher. His eloquence earned him the nickname "Chrysostom" ("golden mouth"). Appointed bishop of Constantinople, seat of the empire, he criticized corruption in the court. As a result, he was exiled by the empress.

Holy Cross Day

Wednesday, September 14, 2022

Helena, mother of Constantine, made a pilgrimage to the Holy Land and found what may be the actual site of Jesus' crucifixion. Her son built two churches there, and the dedication of one of them gave rise to this celebration of our Lord's victory on the cross.

Cyprian, Bishop of Carthage, martyr, died around 258

Friday, September 16, 2022

Cyprian served as a bishop during a time of great persecution of Christians. He insisted on receiving back those who had left the faith under duress. He also provided medical care during a severe epidemic.

Hildegard, Abbess of Bingen, died 1179

Saturday, September 17, 2022

A mystic who was widely influential within the church, Hildegard advised and reproved kings and popes, wrote poems and hymns, and produced treatises in medicine, theology, and natural history. She was also a musician and artist.

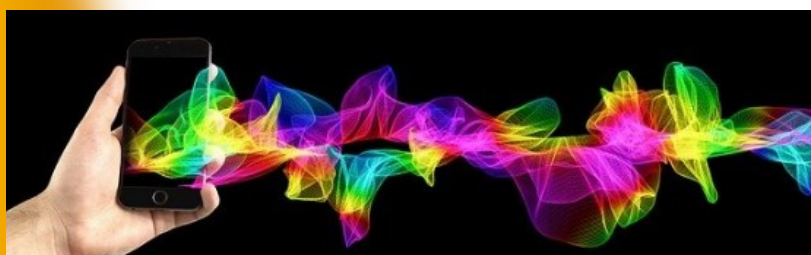
