




NEW ADULT EDUCATION CLASS Wednesdays at 7:00pm Starting October 12th, Pastor Erin will lead "Psalms and Prayers."

Teach Us to Pray 4

Joseph Imhoff

'Prayer may seem a lonely activity. When gladness overflows we are moved to spontaneous praise ... at the expense of others, ... prayer is lonely when we cry out in deep anguish. We may not be a praying people, but sometimes, when grief or trouble comes, we at least verge on prayer...! This observation is made by Philip Pfatteicher in his small book Praying with the Church an Introduction to Prayer in Daily Life. The late Dr. Philip Pfatteicher was a Lutheran Pastor, college professor of English, prolific writer on religious subjects and and the expert everyone cites on Lutheran liturgical practices.


But he went further: 'The truth is, however, we never pray alone. When...we begin to enter that strange and disconcerting temple we call prayer, we join with multitudes of others who share similar lonely cries...We are part of a community that shares in the blessings given through Holy Baptism.' This sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever so, according to Luther, God allies himself with you and becomes one with you in a gracious covenant of comfort.

The line between private and public prayer becomes muddled because the early Christians prayed much as a group, evening, morning and noon as in their Jewish heritage. In monastic tradition there added other times using the third, sixth and ninth hours of the Crucifixion. These are outward signs for true prayer comes through the bond created in Baptism and the Holy Spirit within. In that sense we are linked with the Church of every time and every place in praise of God.

Martin Luther: Every prayer should be concluded with a hearty Amen.

Dear God, I know that my prayer spoken in the name of your dear Son, Jesus Christ, is indeed pleasing to you. It will most surely be heard. Amen. AMEN. \sim

The Grace of Confusion

In today's gospel, Jesus tells a challenging parable about a dishonest steward that ends with an unsettling moral: "And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of dishonest wealth so that when it is gone, they may welcome you into the eternal homes" (Luke 16:9).

Is Jesus being ironic or sincere? Do the characters in the story somehow represent our relationship with God? Are we supposed to emulate the dishonest steward? This text is filled with questions. If you find Jesus' words today perplexing, even baffling, don't worry—you are in good company. Both the details of the parable itself and the lesson Jesus is drawing from it have vexed and puzzled generations of the best interpreters, theologians, and preachers.

There are many plausible ways to explain what is happening and what it means for our lives as Christians that might be explored in your assembly today. At the same time, scriptures like this are a reminder that the life of discipleship does not always come with easy answers and neatly packaged meanings. The gospels frequently report moments when Jesus' disciples simply could not understand what he was saying to them or profoundly misinterpreted his meaning.

The value of the community you join today does not come from the perfect understandings of either the assembly or its leaders. It comes from the one who continues to speak even when we do not understand, who daily affirms God's love for us through the waters of baptism, who offers his own body and blood at the table each week for those who are still struggling and learning what it means to be his disciples—and that includes all of us. In short, the value of the community you join today comes from a Lord committed to leading us as disciples, even when we are unclear of the way. ~

Dag Hammarskjöld, renewer of society, died 1961

Sunday, September 18, 2022

A Swedish diplomat, Hammarskjöld served as the second Secretary General of the United Nations until his death in a plane crash while trying to negotiate peace in present-day Zambia. His journal, published as Markings, revealed the depth of his Christian faith.

Nelson Wesley Trout, bishop, died 1996 (TFF) Tuesday, September 20, 2022

A native of Ohio, Trout served parishes in several parts of the United States before being elected bishop of the South Pacific District of the American Lutheran Church, the first African American Lutheran to serve in such a capacity.


Matthew, Apostle and Evangelist Wednesday, September 21, 2022

Matthew (or Levi) was a tax collector in Capernaum for the Roman government. Tax collectors were frequently despised for dishonesty and for assisting the occupiers. Jesus nevertheless showed love for them, and chose Matthew to be a disciple.
