to decorate the sanctuary, see the information below!





### Homecoming

Grove City College's homecoming is this weekend, I've been receiving E-mails since March about marking the date on my calendar followed by more of the details and today's "Things to Know Before You Go". The logo was a stylized depiction of the arched bridge crossing Wolf Creek separating the upper and lower campuses, above that: ALL ROADS LEAD HOME. Sept 30 - Oct 2, 2022. Each year graduated classes on a five year cycle are invited, this year they are classes ending in 2 and 7 neither of which is my year. Locally, every high school holds their own homecoming inviting their graduates and the public for a celebration of school spirit.

Christ Lutheran Church is celebrating Harvest Homecoming this very same weekend, without a football game though you are free to watch the Steelers later in the afternoon. Fall has alway been the time for churches to sponsor dinners, many hold a form of Oktoberfests or Harvest Home dinners and invite the community to share in the meal and fellowship.

The evangelism committee was thinking of a plan to reach out to members who may not have been to the church in some time, the idea of inviting them to come home was bandied about with harvest time at hand and homecomings abounding in the community and CLC's Oktoberfest already in place something just clicked and the first Harvest Homecoming service was planned for the same weekend as the Oktoberfest, both a reaching out into the community, and they have remained a staple ever since excluding the pandemic years.

#### **Less Is More**

"Increase our faith!" cry the disciples in today's gospel (Luke 17:5). Maybe you have come to worship with the same hope. Our world and lives are full of challenges that constantly test our limits—the limits of our patience, our love, our hope, our capacity for justice and mercy. Wouldn't it be nice to have as much of those things as possible? Wouldn't that allow us to fix this broken world?

But Jesus' response is exactly the opposite—when it comes to faith, he tells his disciples to think small—like the size of a minuscule mustard seed. While that may not sound like enough, it will be if we can let go of thinking we are in control. The power of faith, Jesus tells us, does not come from the quantity we possess; it comes from placing our trust in the one who possesses everything.

If our trust shifts from God to ourselves, no amount of faith will ever be enough. God did not make us to be masters, so when we place ourselves in that position, anxiety and overwhelm are sure to follow. Instead, Christ calls us to be servants of an abundance that we will never possess or control. This is the abundance of God's kingdom—where faith, hope, and love exist without limit. Even the smallest amount of trust in this abundance is enough because it pins our hearts and hopes on the one who is truly in control.

The things this assembly of faith-seekers will offer one another today are small, but with just a mustard seed of faith they can be so much more. Here, simple human words can become the vessels of the divine Word, bringing healing and transformation to our lives. Here, drops of water can wash away sins and create heirs to God's kingdom. Here, bread and wine can become the food that offers us life everlasting through Christ's victory over death. ~

#### **Upcoming Commemorations**

#### Francis of Assisi, renewer of the church, died 1226 Tuesday, October 4, 2022

Born into the family of a wealthy merchant, Francis gave up his inheritance to serve poor people. He formed the Order of Friars Minor (called Franciscans), who took on poverty and the task of preaching "using words if necessary." Francis had a spirit of gratitude for all of God's creation.

#### Theodor Fliedner, renewer of society, died 1864 Tuesday, October 4, 2022

Fliedner helped to bring about a revival of the ministry of deaconesses among Lutherans. He was influenced in this by Moravian deaconesses he had met. The motherhouse he founded in Kaiserswerth, Germany, inspired many around the world to take up this ministry.

#### William Tyndale, translator, martyr, died 1536 Thursday, October 6, 2022

Tyndale was ordained a priest in England, and wished to translate the Bible into English. He was opposed in this by King Henry VIII, causing him to flee to Germany. He completed the New Testament in 1525, but before he could finish the Old Testament, he was tried for heresy and burned at the stake.

### Henry Melchior Muhlenberg, pastor in North America, died 1787 Friday, October 7, 2022

Divided Lutherans in America asked leaders in Europe to send someone who could take charge and unite their work. Muhlenberg was sent, and was effective in organizing the American Lutherans. Among other accomplishments, his liturgical principles became the basis for the Common Service of 1888.
