From the Pastor's Desk: Stewardship Series Part 3

Last week I asked in Part 2, "What would compel you to regularly support the ministry of Christ Lutheran Church?" Many Christians will support their congregations, when they attend, by putting some cash in the offering plate. But that gift may just be determined by the cash you have left over at the end of the weekend. Faithful stewardship asks us to choose ahead of time what we will give, from first fruits, not leftovers. At the beginning of each month, anticipate what your income will be, and set a goal for yourself. If you don't anticipate being in church each Sunday of the month, you can go online easily.

A regular gift to the church is so much more than just about paying the bills though. As spiritual and material creatures, we have a spiritual need to offer sacrifice. This is not a sacrifice of burnt offerings - God does not need our sacrifice to be pleased - but in our actions we confront spiritual realities. We give up something of ourselves as a way to place our trust in God to provide.

I regularly need to be reminded that God provides, that it's not all up to me, that God is God, and I am not. That's what compels me to give regularly. The reason I give to THIS church is because I believe in the mission, and trust that God has placed us here for a reason. My choice to give regularly reminds me of the mission we have to be in the neighborhood for good, and reminds me to be thankful for what I have and can give.

November of every year marks the end of the Church Year, you know I'm always very aware of how various calendars work in fixing the dates of past events and planning future events. The everyday calendar we use had the prefix AD, Anno Domini (the year of our Lord), has become CE, the common era as it has been renamed by the secular world we live in. All of the Christian dates were fixed against the Julian Roman calendar coinciding with the Hebrew calendar beginning with the Crucifixion through a very complicated formula common to astrologers in the middle ages around 750 AD!

Advent begins the Church Year, Sunday, November 27 in 2022. Since the 5th century it has been considered the time of preparation for Christmas and the birth of Christ.

Which brings me to a note written in a Christmas card I received last Christmas. I was going through last year's batch of cards before putting them out for recycling this week, checking the addresses for correctness and noting from I received cards and those I didn't. One portion of a letter caught my eye, "But the year is nearly over, the Church Year with its Advent "housecleaning" has already begun. So, lift up your hearts and count blessings!"

The writer of this sentiment has it correct, November 27th is the New Year's Day for the Church and like the resolutions made at midnight when the ball drops and the fireworks go off we, as members of CLC and the wider Church should make our resolutions, run the vacuum cleaner and take out the trash of old thought and ideas and prepare to start anew with the retelling of the birth of our Savior. Think of hearing with new ears as if it's the first time, with awe and wonder. ~



Beware and Trust

In an instant, documents are signed six thousand miles away, and suddenly you have no job. In an instant the walls rattle, the floors rumble, ceilings crack, and you have no home. In an instant the lights flicker, the signals weaken, the screens go blank, and you have no connections. In an instant a door slams, a voice shouts, a car screeches, and you have no one. In an instant the dam breaks, the fire blazes, the winds ravage, and . . . and what?

What is the world coming to? Shadowing every calamity, circling the grounds of every collapse, chasing every human tragedy, prophets and pundits are sure to announce that all is lost. They are eager to foretell all futures eroded, ready to broadcast that all hope is dead, all tomorrows canceled, all creation buried. But beware!

"Beware" hardly has the lilting tone of a glad good-news bell. "Beware" bites at our ears and strikes our heartbeat like the cold peal of a brass tongue slapping against a pitted funeral bell. "Beware" is the screech of the siren, the shout before battle, the shudder at the edge of lonely nightfall. "Beware" scarcely sounds like gospel, but it is the exact gospel word Jesus chooses to post like an iron stanchion into bedrock in the midst of uncertain and frightening times. Pay attention; listen closely to Jesus' "beware." It is not beware of wars and rising nations, plagues and earthquakes, arrests and persecutions. Jesus instead cautions: beware of those prophets and pundits, of their timetables of destruction, their signs of the end, and their oracles of despair. Beware of them. The world may tremble fiercely, you may be hated unjustly, you may know betrayal painfully, yet with the strength of iron in bedrock and the sound of the gospel bell ringing, Jesus encourages us: "Beware \dots do not be terrified" (Luke 21:8-9). \sim




Upcoming Commemorations

Elizabeth of Hungary, renewer of society, died 1231 Thursday, November 17, 2022

Born in Hungary, Elizabeth was betrothed to the son of the Landgrave of Thuringia, and at age four was taken to be raised with him at the Wartburg Castle. Ten years later they were married. She was very generous to the poor, and after her husband's death she lived in cruel hardship until her own death at age twenty-four.
