

# **Stewardship Series Part 4**

If you can't go shopping, you can donate to support, and gifts will be purchased.



# **Advent 1, Martin Luther**

Help us to remain so steadfast that your coming kingdom will include and complete your kingdom begun here. Lead us out of this sinful and dangerous life. Help us to hate this life and to long for that life that is to come. Enable us not to dread death but to welcome it. Release us from the love and attachments of this life, so that your kingdom may be totally completed in us. Amen

Not surprisingly, Martin Luther provided prayers for every occasion, often more then one. For these four weeks of Advent I have chosen the ones recommended for each of those weeks. To help me along I found on-line Concordia Theological Quarterly, Vol 62:Nr 4, Oct 98, Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, Ind., the subject being the Preaching of Luther in Advent and Christmas by John T. Pless.

It is observed that Advent and Christmas evoke the best in Luther's preaching as he proclaims Bethlehem's crib in light of the cross. Ulrich Asendorf rightly notes that "Luthers Advent sermons are a microcosm of his spiritual word." Side note: there are over 110 of his Christmas sermons know, half of them based on Luke 2: 1-20, comments welcome.

Somehow the basis for his First Sunday of Advent sermon is the reading from Matthew 21:1-9, Christ's entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday. You saw that right! Is there a contradiction? It might seem so but there parallels to be found.

"Christ comes riding along like a beggar on a borrowed donkey, meekly, poor and lowly." There was the long trip from Nazareth to Bethlehem, with Mary on the donkey as is often pictured. The crowds shouting "Hosannah!" were humble people, many of whom had heard his preaching but others were expecting more because didn't understand the prophesies of the Old Testament. At the stable were shepherds, the humblest of the humble in society of that day. The "Glory to God in the Highest" was proclaimed by the angels in heaven, but who on earth was listening?

"But don't let your eyes deceive you. At that time, it seemed like a small and insignificant thing for him to come riding on a borrowed donkey and later to be crucified, in order to take away sin, death, and hell. No one could tell this by his appearance, but the prophet foretold it, and his work later fulfilled it. Therefore we must simply grasp it with our ears and believe it with our hearts, for our eyes are blind." ~



# 1st Sunday of Advent - Time to Wake Up

Advent is a season of waking up. Even as the days grow darker, we are awoken to the light of truth about our lives, the world, and, ultimately, God. But no one really likes being woken from sleep, real or metaphorical. No one likes being pulled from a cozy blanket to a crowded commute, from dreams to reality, from what's comfortable and "always has been" to what's actually happening right now. It's why when we have pivotal, perhaps painful moments in our lives in which we become aware of something previously hidden, or about which we shed the veil of denial, we refer to them as "wake-up calls."

Yet it is never God's intent to hurt us by rousing us from sleep. It is not to punish us for our past mistakes, to expose our inner failings to the world, or to add to the already deep well of shame that so many of us carry. It is for our good that God comes to reveal that which was hidden, breaking into our world as human flesh and blood. And it is for our good that, through our baptism, we are able to "put on the Lord Jesus Christ" (Romans 13:14). The divine image is revealed in you, and in every friend and stranger. God knows, loves, and takes delight in each of us.

That is why nations will beat their swords into plowshares, their spears into pruning hooks, and their guns into gravel to build a highway for our God. We won't need to learn war anymore, as the prophet says (Isaiah 2:4), because you can't raise arms against your own kin, another person in whom the living Christ dwells.

This season is a time for us to awaken to this new reality: at any moment, and at every moment, Christ lives among and within us, helping us rub the sleep out of our eyes, and revealing a different way. Welcome to Advent. ~


