




The Food Pantry is Open Mondays and Fridays from 9:30am to 11:30am, and on Wednesdays from 5pm to 7pm.

Advent 4, Martin Luther

Joseph Imhoff

Lord Jesus Christ, hurry. Do not delay in bringing the blessed day when the hope of happy redemption will be fulfilled. For this reason you have asked us to pray: Thy kingdom come. Since you have so commanded us to pray, give us grace and help us to pray diligently, firmly believing that we shall finally come to such glory. Continually mortify this old body that we may finally receive a new body not so full of sin nor so inclined to all manner of evil as the life we now live. Give us bodies that will not become sick, nor suffer persecutions, nor die. Give us bodies redeemed from all temporal and spiritual misery, like your own glorified body, dear Lord Jesus Christ. Grant that the glad and blessed day of our redemption and glorification may come soon, and that we may realize it as we now hear and believe your word. Amen.

Martin Luther focuses this Fourth Sunday on John the Baptist being quizzed and prodded by the priests and Levites, the highest noble class of Pharisees, John 1:19-28. "And this is the witness of John, when the Jews sent unto him from Jerusalem priests and Levites to ask him, Who art thou?" (1:19) When they could not have him admit to being the Christ they tried flattery with equating him with Elijah since Malachi had prophesied Elijah would return before the day of the Lord.

As we know from last week John spoke of himself as only being a messenger, the forerunner of the one to come and not a prophet although Jesus applies the Elijah designation to him.

To top this all Martin Luther gives us his own reading of what John might have told the crowd. "First I have, by my teaching, made you all sinners, have condemned your works and told you to despair of yourselves. But in order that you may not despair of God, behold, I will show how to get rid of your sins and obtain salvation. Not that you can strip off your sins...another man is needed for this; nor can I do it, I can point him out, however. It is Jesus Christ, the Lamb of God. He, he, and no one else either in heaven or on earth takes our sins upon himself....all the sins of the world, be they great or small, many or few."

4th Sunday of Advent - Messenger in the Night

What did you dream about last night? Is there really any meaning in these vivid storylines that our brains assemble while we sleep? If you think dreams are essentially random firings of our neurons, you might just laugh them off. If you think they do tap into something real, you might try to unpack them. But almost no one makes important life decisions based solely on their dreams, right?

The stakes couldn't have been higher for Joseph and his dream, in which an angel tells him about Mary's unexpected pregnancy by the Holy Spirit. If he stays, he's got a story to tell that nobody is going to believe. But if he goes, if he "dismisses her quietly" as the gospel writer puts it, what's going to happen to her? What's going to happen to the baby?

It might seem that a message in a dream would be the worst possible way to make a decision as consequential as this. But if the purpose of our dreams is to put us in touch with what we already know, if it's to help us sort out our tangled-up emotions and give us some clarity, then perhaps a dream whose message is "Do not be afraid" is exactly what Joseph needs.

The dream-angel, in quoting the prophet Isaiah, helps Joseph connect his present reality with God's past faithfulness and promises. The angel reminds him that even in this terrifying situation, God is with him. We need such assurances as well when it feels like our world is falling apart: messengers to remind us who we really are and to whom we belong. Today we celebrate that Joseph trusted that message, and Mary before him. In them we see that God is faithful, and fear is cast out by the birth of this child. ~


