





Advent 2, Martin Luther

"Graciously hurry the coming of that day. Bless and prepare us with the wisdom and strength that in the meantime we may walk wisely and uprightly. May we joyfully wait for the coming of your dear Son and so depart blessed from this valley of sorrow. Amen."

Martin Luther used Luke 21:25-36 as the basis for his sermon, the coming of the Son of Man, to be watchful and alert. "Last Sunday you heard about his riding into Jerusalem on a donkey, minus all pretentious show. He had no place to call his own, not even a foot of space."

Instead of focusing on the nearness of the coming Christmas, Luther describes how the Pope preaches a Christ who is a stern judge with whom we must be reconciled by our works then goes on to preach the comfort which is to be found in Christ's final advent. "In this Gospel he teaches us differently, namely, that he will come not to judge and damn us but to redeem and save us, and to fulfill all for which we have petitioned him, and to bring us his kingdom."

During this Advent season "Light One Candle to Watch for Messiah" has been chosen as the song to be sung for the lighting of the Advent Wreath, each week a different stanza represents one, then two, the third and finally all four candles. They reflect in a few short words what Martin Luther is saying.

"There is no one so well prepared for the judgement day as he who longs to be without sin. If you have such desire, what do you fear? You are then in perfect accord with the purpose of that day. It comes to set free from sin all who desire it, and you belong in that number. Return thanks to God and abide in that desire.

Luther urges his hearers to find joy in the glad announcement that "your redemption draweth nigh." ~



2nd Sunday of Advent - An Impossible Vision?

Today's image from the Old Testament reading of a world at peace—a peace so full and universal that it extends to every living creature—may feel as comforting as it does unbelievable, at least by our logic (Isaiah 11:1-10). Wolves and lambs aren't friends. Lions don't eat straw. Children should not play with snakes. In the animal kingdom—and we are animals—there are predators and prey. Whether we take it literally or metaphorically, "Eat or be eaten" is how we've been taught to survive in the wilderness.

And yet here, on this wilderness morning, we hear the prophet telling us that it does not have to be this way—indeed, that it will not be this way forever. In the new world God is coming to bring, we won't need to tear each other apart just to survive. Somehow we will be able to live together in peace.

No wonder that of all the ways God could have revealed the depths of holy love and brought reconciliation to the world, God chose to come as a little child, a child no one thought possible, a branch from a tree that was seemingly long dead.

Beholding this child moves us to repentance, turning us from all the ways we demonize and hurt each other, and calling us instead to offer peace. Rather than taking the bait set to keep us fighting, we come together to eat the bread and drink from the cup set at the Lord's table.

In the new creation, our identity is no longer defined by our—lineage or status, as those who came to be baptized by John imagined, or by being enemies, prey, or predator. Instead, in Christ's baptismal waters we are given a new life as beloved kin. With God all things are possible! ~

Upcoming Commemorations

John of Damascus, theologian and hymnwriter, died around 749 Sunday, December 4, 2022


A monk in an abbey near Jerusalem, John wrote many hymns as well as theological works. One of his works, The Fount of Wisdom, remained influential for centuries.

Nicholas, Bishop of Myra, died around 342 Tuesday, December 6, 2022

Little is known about Nicholas, except that he was a bishop in presentday Turkey. According to legend, he was famous for his giving to the poor, and so has become a symbol of anonymous gift-giving.

Ambrose, Bishop of Milan, died 397 Wednesday, December 7, 2022

While a governor of northern Italy, Ambrose was elected bishop of Milan on the same day he was baptized. He was a famous preacher, a writer of hymns we still sing today, and helped lead St. Augustine to faith.
