

Daylight Savings Time begins tonight, Saturday, March 11; please remember to turn your clocks ahead one hour!



You asked, I'll answer! Question: What is a Deacon? Answer:



That's a great question! Deacon Amy Santoriello led worship here several weeks ago. In the ELCA, deacons have very similar theological training as pastors, either a 2 year or 4 years degree from a seminary, based on their field. Pastors are ordained to the ministry of "Word and Sacrament" while deacons are ordained to the ministry of "Word and Service."

You may remember Stephen as the first deacon in the New Testament, and from the earliest times of the church, deacons were serving the people. Deacons were the eyes and ears of the early church, reporting needs to the church, and addressing them.

Deacons can lead worship and preach, and many do. But deacons also serve as chaplains, therapists, musicians, seminary faculty, church administrators, social workers and teachers in places other than churches. Deacons often have training and education for specialized ministry or ministry to a specific demographic, As ministers of word and service, they are called to serve God's people and equip them for service, connecting the church to the needs of the world.

## The Daffodils

This morning as I looked over the bannister of my front porch I saw that the first stem in one of the clumps of daffodils had burst forth and was nearly completely open. It had been weeks since they had first pushed their shoots through the crust of earth and into one of the few dustings of snow we have had. It's also time to the crocus to its blossom too. Both are the sign that Spring is nearly here. This Sunday Daylight Saving Time will begin and on Monday, March 20, the Vernal Equinox will take place at 5:24 EDT making Spring official.

Christians have a unique perspective concerning Spring and the words used to describe it. Lent, according to one source, comes from the late Old or early Middle English verb for lengthen; the days become longer and soon the first fruits will arrive. Easter stems from the Dutch and German word 'Ost' or East where days begin. It is then natural we wait the forty days of our Lenten discipline for the First Fruit risen from the dead which is the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.

As with the first daffodils we look forward to our own resurrection to life eternal as the blossoms that follow. The hyacinths and the tulips will be coming along though they take a little longer. And I haven't seen any change on the forsythia shrub at the back of the yard.

One flower we associate with the season is the white lily, the Easter lily, which under natural conditions will not be in bloom for quite some time. Thanks to good horticulture and greenhouses they are available to add that special touch to the Easter Celebration. The form for ordering flowers for the chancel on Easter Sunday is being distributed in the Weekly Update available in the narthex, the deadline is Sunday, March 19. No daffodils are available!

## **GUSHING** with GRACE

The word gush has nuances of meaning. On the one hand, it can speak to large amounts of a liquid flowing forth. A geyser gushing water is quite different than a leaky faucet letting water through a drop at a time. On the other hand, gush can speak to our enthusiasm about a person, place, or experience. A person gushing about a new movie to a friend carries different energy than someone saying, "Eh, it was okay."

In today's gospel we get the first sense of this word as Jesus tells the Samaritan woman about the water he will give, which will become a spring that gushes up to eternal life. The word gush is not used again in the story, but the second part of the narrative gathers up the spirit of the other sense of gush as the woman goes back to the city and shares her experience of Jesus. Many in the city come to believe because of her witness; she must have been gushing forth energy and excitement about her encounter with Jesus.

As the church takes on the ministry of Jesus after the resurrection, we find other people springing forth in the same way Jesus talks about water gushing. Peter heals someone in Acts 3:8 who jumps up and leaps (gushes) in praise. Paul also heals someone in Acts 14:10 who springs up (gushes) and walks.

The water in your baptismal font may be still, or it may be moving; it may be more reminiscent of a trickle than a gush. Yet we know that it is God's word that gives the plain water the power to shape us as God's people. Baptism is never a trickle; it is always a gush of grace poured out for us with the endless love and mercy of God. May we be blessed to gush along with the Samaritan woman about our experiences of Jesus among us. ~

### Gregory the Great, Bishop of Rome, died 604 Sunday, March 12, 2023 Born into wealth and power, Gregory was for a time the chief administrator of the city of Rome. Giving this up for a life in the church, he was elected pope in 590. He influenced public worship through

the establishment of a lectionary

and prayers to correlate with the readings. Gregorian chant is named in his honor.

#### Patrick, bishop, missionary to Ireland, died 461 Friday, March 17, 2023

A native of Britain, Patrick was kidnapped by pirates at age sixteen and sold into slavery in Ireland. After a few years, he escaped, returned home, and entered the ministry. Returning to Ireland, he successfully served as a bishop and missionary there.
