

Voting members from your congregation have an important responsibility on behalf of all the members of the Southwestern Pennsylvania Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

This assembly is the highest legislative authority of our synod; they will be making decisions that impact 151 congregations covering 10 counties in southwest PA.

This year's assembly will begin with an evening of business conducted online via Zoom, followed by a day of gathering together in person to worship, work, and remember that we are always better together.

Submit an anonymous question in the offering plate, and you might get your question answered in the Weekly Update! Have a Bible question? A Church question? A burning query about what the number of candles means and why? Ask away!

Question: What about Matthew 19:9? "And I say to you, whoever divorces his wife, except for unchastity, and marries another commits adultery."

People divorce and remarry all the time. If they divorce because "It didn't work out" and not because of unfaithfulness, are they supposed to leave their new spouse and go back to their first spouse?

Answer: Thanks for your question! This is a bit of a deeper issue than one verse about divorce, so let's dig in.

Here's the whole scene:

Some Pharisees came to him, and to test him they asked, 'Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife for any cause?' He answered, 'Have you not read that the one who made them at the beginning "made them male and female", and said, "For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh"? So they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate.' They said to him, 'Why then did Moses command us to give a certificate of dismissal and to divorce her?' He said to them, 'It was because you were so hard-hearted that Moses allowed you to divorce your wives, but at the beginning it was not so. And I say to you, whoever divorces his wife, except for unchastity, and marries another commits adultery.'

This is a trick question. The Jewish law was that a man could divorce his wife for any cause. The Pharisees ask this question to see if Jesus is going to "keep" the law and uphold it in his teachings, that a man could divorce his wife for any reason. A woman had no rights to divorce for any reason, and so could be put out on the street at the whim of her husband, with no recourse. Her family would be unlikely to take her back, and she'd have no money or social standing. So yeah, Jesus says, that's not right, that's not God's intention for marriage.

Answer continued:

And the Pharisees can now say, "Aha! you don't uphold Moses' law!

And Christians today can say, "Aha! Jesus says that Christians can't get divorced!"

As a divorced and remarried person myself, I've preached on all this multiple times. The Law that Moses gives is "accommodation to human struggle, not an expression of the divine ideal" *see footnote below

Divorce is the result of sin - a broken consequence of broken relationships, whatever the cause or fault. I can only speak for myself, but I've long since asked for and received forgiveness from God, and from the people I've served. As a pastor, my life is a public witness to the gospel, and also a public witness to the power of God to give new life and second chances. Where we have broken what God has joined together, God can pick up the pieces to make all things new.


Looking back to the scripture through the lens of its historical situation, Jesus' strong view of marriage, protects the most vulnerable in his society, women and children, from destitution and/or abuse. He reasserts that divorce is contrary to God's plan for us to care for each other, but within the larger framework of his mission and ministry, continues to emphasize forgiveness, new life, and equality in the eyes of God. This topic is way too long for just one bulletin blurb, but if divorce is something that you have struggled with or are currently facing, my door is always open.

More Than One Sunday



The music and pageantry are but a memory, the lilies and tulips have been repotted and sitting on the porch or planted in the garden, Easter has officially passed, or has it. According to the church calendar Easter is a season lasting fifty days until Pentecost, forty of which the risen Lord is still with us and appearing to many until his Ascension to the Father. Each of the Sundays used to have intriguing names in Latin based on the Introit or introduction to the theme of the Sunday before a revised lectionary was was introduced. They are:

- 1) As newborn babes desire the sincere milk of the word, O hear my people.
- 2) The earth is full of the goodness of the Lord.
- 3) Make a joyful noise unto God, all ye lands: sing forth the honor of His Name.
- 4) O sing to the Lord a new song: for he has done marvelous things.
- 5) With a voice of singing declare ye, and tell this: utter even unto the end of the earth.
 - The Ascension of our Lord
- 1) Hear, O Lord, when I cry with my voice: Hallelujah.
 The Festival of Pentecost

These Sundays are often referred to as the low Sundays, not because the attendance of the Easter Sunday celebration has diminished, but because the 'high' church pageantry of celebration with all the stops pulled out has been returned to the ordinary form.

Any one of these themes would be worthy of note in the liturgical cycle but they comprise one season and one celebration, the Resurrection of our Lord! \sim



A Wild, Skeptical Hope

"Doubting Thomas" is nearly always meant as a pejorative, but Jesus shows up for him. It's easy to forget that Thomas is asking for nothing more than what Jesus has already provided to his friends—showing up for them, in the flesh. When he does the same for Thomas and Thomas exclaims, "My Lord and my God!" (John 20:28), Jesus responds, "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe" (John 20:29). It's easy to hear this as if Jesus were chastising Thomas while he blesses the rest of us, but he does no such thing. He can show up for Thomas and bless the rest of us all at the same time.

Can you even imagine what those days must have been like—those days between the crucifixion and resurrection, and then the days that followed, full to the brim with confusion and grief and rumors and wild, skeptical hope? Two thousand years can make us forgetful, as if those who were present in those moments had the luxury of knowing the entire story all at once, the way we do.

But they didn't. Regardless, Thomas believed in a God big enough to carry his doubts and uncertainty. He trusted that God was big enough to hold all his questions and his hope.

What are the big doubts you carry? What are your questions? What kind of wild, skeptical hopes do you have, that you hardly dare to utter out loud, even to your closest friends? Do they feel any different when you stop to wonder about letting God carry them with you?

Here, at the beginning of the Easter season, God has shown us that very little is truly impossible. Thomas believed as much, and he had the courage to ask for it. Jesus shows up in response to Thomas's bold ask, and through this witness, he blesses the rest of us. ~






Upcoming Commemorations



Olavus Petri, priest, died 1552; Laurentius Petri, Bishop of Uppsala, died 1573; renewers of the church Wednesday, April 19, 2023

These two brothers studied with Luther at the University of Wittenberg and then returned to their native Sweden to introduce the Lutheran reforms. Olavus published a catechism and hymnal; Laurentius was a professor who defended the office of bishop and later became one.



Anselm, Bishop of Canterbury, died 1109 Friday, April 21, 2023

This eleventh-century monk was one of the greatest theologians of the Middle Ages. He is remembered for emphasizing the maternal aspects of God, and for the theory that the Son of God became human in order to make the necessary payment for our sin.



Day of the Creation (Día de la Creación) (LLC) Saturday, April 22, 2023

This observance invites us to notice and give God thanks for the wonders of the created universe. As stewards of that creation, we are also challenged to be careful in our use of it.
