

JOHN 20:22

Pentecost derives its name from the Jewish festival celebrating the harvest and the giving of the law on Mount Sinai fifty days after Passover. Fifty days after Easter, we celebrate the Holy Spirit as God's presence within and among us. In Acts the Spirit arrives in rushing wind and flame, bringing God's presence to all people. Paul reminds us that though we each have different capacities, we are unified in the Spirit that equips us with these gifts. Jesus breathes the Holy Spirit on his disciples, empowering them to forgive sin. We celebrate that we too are given the breath of the Holy Spirit and sent out to proclaim God's redeeming love to all the world. ~

"Ask The Pastor"

NEW QUESTION and ANSWER!

Submit an anonymous question in the offering plate, and you might get your question answered in the Weekly Update! Have a Bible question? A Church question? A burning query about what the number of candles means and why? Ask away!

You asked, I'll answer!

Question: Are there written/unwritten rules on interacting with a pastor outside of church? (Hey, we are going over Fred and Mary's to watch the game, Do you and Brian want to come?) I have grown up with the pastor not being treated like a standard person.

Answer: A decade ago, I ran into a parishioner at the mall, in a store with the initials V.S. Thankfully for everyone involved, I was standing in line with only a few bottles of lotion. There are no written or unwritten rules governing what to do in those situations. But here are some of my thoughts about interacting with clergy "in the wild."

The spiritual and moral elevation of clergy has been an issue in the church since the beginning. One of Luther's key arguments was the normalization of vocation, a call from God, to mean more than a call to the priesthood or religious life as a monk or nun. Each person has an important calling from God, and serving the church as a pastor is not a better call, a holier call or a more important one, just a different one. I am no more spiritual, holy, or good, than anyone else. I just have a different job because I have a different calling.

What are the differences? For one, my role in the world is public. I am a very public witness to the gospel, especially when I wear a black shirt with a little white collar. As a public servant of the church, my actions and words are judged as such. Is that always accurate or fair? No, but it's kind of part of the job. I'm expected to speak for the Church, so I have to clearly distinguish between my opinions and Church teaching and Church "Stuff." Even on vacation. So I keep good boundaries about what I share, with who, and how I share it.

Another difference is my role as a leader in the parish and the wider church, but my leadership should empower others continued

to lead, not exert authoritarian influence or abuse of power. Constitutionally, a pastor's role is to preach the gospel and administer the sacraments. In those two things, the pastor of a congregation is the authority. All other manner of church business requires a working partnership between the leaders of the congregation and the pastor who has been elected and called by God and by the Church to lead.

Now, am I a standard person? I know loads of pastors, and for the most part we are very normal. If you ask my family, I have quite a few flaws, and I'll own most of them. I have a spouse and a daughter, and I stress about all the normal things moms and wives stress about. I don't set aside enough time for devotional prayer as I should. I can be a bit sarcastic. I like to nap a bit too much.

But what I think you are asking, dear Questioner, is "Can I treat my pastor like a friend?" My answer would be "Yes, please, I'd love to come watch the game, what can I bring?" I'll pet your dog, and I'll enjoy a cold beverage, and you can hear all about the latest adventure of my 6 year old, and we can talk about anything you like. But I am your pastor, and I serve a different role than "friend".

When my time at this particular congregation ends, you'll have a new pastor, and there will be boundaries to our relationship, because I will no longer be your pastor. Would I love to hear from you? Sure! Would I rather you talk to your new pastor and get to know them? Yes. Will I give you spiritual advice, or listen to you complain about the new thing that the new pastor is doing, or officiate a wedding for you, or preach at a funeral for you? No. Because that is no longer my role. That being said, some people and some pastors aren't good with boundaries. But we all have room for growth.



As always, please feel free to talk to me in more detail! I'm normal, I swear, and my door is always open. Unless I'm napping.

Spirit of Unexpected Peace

Jesus, crucified and risen Lord of mercy, had a mission for his disciples: share the forgiveness they have received with all those longing to know God. He even had the promised gift of the Spirit to empower them. But first, he had to figure out how to get them out from behind locked doors. Jesus' disciples were afraid that what had happened to Jesus would also happen to them, so they locked themselves away and hid.

You could picture Jesus standing outside the door of their room, calling: Come on out! It's okay! Don't worry! It's time to start sharing the good news! And the disciples would just say: No! We're too afraid to open the door!

Instead of getting them out from behind their locked door, Jesus comes on in. Instead of yelling through the door to stop being such cowards, Jesus slips past their fear and their locked-up lives and brings them unexpected peace. His own Spirit of peace moves out of him as breath, as the wind of God that creates new things, and creates in them a new calming faith. Then the mission of mercy begins. This Spirit from Jesus is a pure gift that creates peace, and peace creates mission.

Fear often keeps us locked up, anxious, unable to live the life God has given us. Thankfully, Jesus knows the way past our locked doors and our fearful hiding. Instead of making us feel small for hiding when we are afraid, he breaks through whatever barriers we put up and gets right past our locked doors. Jesus' own Spirit comes to us through the word, through bread and wine, through silence, through the one next to us, slipping past whatever barriers we put up. The Spirit comes as a gift of peace—peace we can't create for ourselves, peace that is deeper than our own understanding of it, peace that creates new energy for mission. ~


Jiri Tranovský, hymnwriter, died 1637 Monday, May 29, 2023

Tranovský is considered to be the father of Slovak hymnody as well as an important reformer of the Slavic church. He translated the Augsburg Confession (the basis of Lutheran teachings) and published a collection of Slovak hymns.



Visit of Mary to Elizabeth Wednesday, May 31, 2023

This festival marks the occasion when Mary, pregnant with Jesus, visited her cousin Elizabeth who was herself pregnant with John. Elizabeth pronounced Mary "blessed among women," and Mary responded with the song called the Magnificat.



Justin, martyr at Rome, died around 165 Thursday, June 1, 2023

Born of pagan parents, Justin was influenced by an elderly Christian in Ephesus. He became a teacher of philosophy and the Christian faith. Jailed for practicing an unauthorized religion, he refused to renounce his faith and was beheaded.

The Martyrs of Uganda, died 1886 Saturday, June 3, 2023

On June 3, 1886, thirty-two young men were burned to death for refusing to renounce Christianity. The confident manner in which these Christians went to their deaths contributed to a much stronger Christian presence in Uganda.





John XXIII, Bishop of Rome, died 1963 Saturday, June 3, 2023

When elected pope, the former Angelo Roncalli was expected to be a short-term caretaker. He showed great spirit, though, and convened the Second Vatican Council which helped bring great changes to Roman Catholic and other churches.
