





"Ask The Pastor"

NEW QUESTION and ANSWER!

Submit an anonymous question in the offering plate, and you might get your question answered in the Weekly Update! Have a Bible question? A Church question? A burning query about what the number of candles means and why? Ask away!

You asked, I'll answer!

Question: How does the church decide which readings to do every week? Do they rotate every year or so? Do certain churches focus on different disciples' perspectives or is it up to the pastor?

Answer: Good questions! Most mainline denominations follow the Revised Common Lectionary. (RCL) This provides a three-year series of readings for Sunday, with the first Sunday of the church year being the first Sunday of Advent. For each Sunday and festival, three readings and a psalm are suggested and include: a Gospel reading, an Old Testament reading, and a New Testament reading. The lectionary comes from an ecumenical consultation of liturgical scholars and denominational representatives from the United States and Canada.

Each year of the Revised Common Lectionary centers on one of the synoptic Gospels — Matthew, Mark and Luke. The Gospel of John is read periodically in all three years and is especially frequent in Year B.

This provides a framework that structures our worship life together around the calendar of the church, and prevents the subject of preaching from being totally at the discretion of the pastor.

While it is far from the entirety of scripture - using the RCL gives a wide variety of texts, forcing preachers to go beyond just what they'd like to preach about or want to talk about.

However it's not mandated, and many congregations find sermon series to be a helpful interjection and change of pace particularly during the long summer months when you find yourself celebrating the 74th Sunday after Pentecost.

No Seeds Wasted

Throughout history, people have looked at the growth of plants from seed to seed and seen that as an illustration of God's work in the world. Everything else comes in limited supply, but it's fairly easy to observe that from just one seed, you can get dozens of seeds—or even more. Who but God could make so much out of so little? Even if we understand the mechanisms of growing plants and know that those extra seeds aren't really coming from nowhere, we still don't have total control of the process.

Jesus compares the different ways seeds might develop to the various ways people might respond to hearing the good news.

Just as many different factors can affect seeds, many factors affect people.

It's easy to assume that the ideal scenario is the one that produces the biggest harvest. But God also cares for the birds that eat the seeds. God can use the short-lived plants in rocky soil to enrich the earth, slowly making it more suitable for growth. Is it possible that none of the seeds was really wasted?

What if the same thing is true whenever people hear the good news? What if an obvious harvest of large numbers isn't always the best sign that God is working? What if we assumed that, no matter what results we see, God is always working in the world? How would that change the way we gather, the way we share good news, the way we care about one another?

What if the seeds of God's word cannot be wasted? God's word cannot be limited, or used up, or shut out, or shut in. Even if we somehow manage to throw away all of God's word in the world, God is always sending more. God is always sending Jesus!

Upcoming Commemorations

Bartolomé de Las Casas, missionary to the Indies, died 1566 Monday, July 17, 2023



A native of Spain, Las Casas first came to the Western hemisphere while serving in the military. Upon arriving in the West, Las Casas was granted a large estate with Indigenous enslaved people whom he freed after he was ordained a priest. He worked in the Caribbean and Central America to improve the lives of the native peoples.

Mary Magdalene, Apostle Saturday, July 22, 2023

Sometimes called "the apostle to the apostles" because she told them of her encounter with the risen Lord, Mary was a woman of Galilee who followed Jesus throughout his ministry. She was present at Jesus' crucifixion and his burial.
