






SPIRITUAL DRUMMING

Ashes and Dust

Tuesday: Tomorrow is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the Church season known as Lent. Pastor Erin at the evening service will offer the imposition of ashes on the foreheads of those who wish it. From noon until one in the afternoon "Ashes to Go" will be offered in the heart of Millvale to those unable to attend regular services. One local business owner I know, she's Catholic, was very appreciative of the opportunity last year.

Ashes and sackcloth were signs of mourning both in Biblical times and in many cultures around the world, though sackcloth may be hard to come by at Joanne Fabrics these days.

Still, they remain a symbol and part of the language, "Ashes to ashes, dust to dust." The beginning of Lent isn't about mourning and death in one sense and yet in another it is.

The ashes used are by tradition the burnt palm branches of the previous Palm Sunday, the fire burns away the impurities and we are left with ashes or the dust. "Remember thou art but dust, and unto dust thou shalt return."

Dust and ashes are curious in that they become the soil from which new life springs. Where wild fires have raged new vegetation can set down roots quickly in the enriched soil, the nutrients being concentrated by the flames, a new crop of plants taking hold from dead seed planted in the ashes. We can grow in the the new soil (dust and ashes) of our lives.

Remind yourself that the ashes are still on your forehead even though you've washed your face and can't see them. They are there because you asked for them and like the oil placed on the forehead at Baptism should be in the form of a cross.

As one pastor mused years ago, "That way Jesus will see you coming from a far distance and hurry to greet you!" ~



How Beloved You Are!

Jesus' journey to the cross and resurrection begins with his baptism. As the church journeys with Jesus through Lent and toward Easter, we each remember our own baptism, and our life in Christ is renewed.

At the Jordan River, God stops at nothing to declare Jesus beloved. Not even the sky can cloud the message; God tears open the heavens and proclaims it loud and clear. Now each time we dip our hands into the font or trace the sign of the cross over our bodies, we remember this promise anew: "You are a beloved child of God." Nothing can separate you from God's love.

Immediately after baptism, Jesus must contend with Satan and wild beasts in the wilderness. Then, before Jesus' ministry begins, John is arrested. The Gospel of Mark doesn't give the fact more than a passing mention at this point in the story, but John's arrest and subsequent death make for a trauma that comes at a crucial moment in Jesus' life. How was Jesus able to begin his ministry after all he had been through? And how are we, who have experienced temptation, torment, or trauma, to journey on?

The journey is not easy for Jesus, and neither will it be for us. But it's amazing what is possible when you know just how beloved you are. How long must the voice of God have echoed in Jesus' mind after that baptism day! Perhaps the angels whispered in his ear as they waited on him: "You are beloved. With you God is well pleased." Every Sunday, we return to the waters because we can never have too many reminders. When times get tough, we can trust in the promises of God made to us in baptism. This is a flood that saves us. These waters bring new life out of death. God's love will stop at nothing. Today, remember just how beloved you are! ~

Upcoming Commemorations

Martin Luther, renewer of the church, died 1546 Saturday, February 18, 2023

Though he began his adult church life as a simple Augustinian monk, Luther challenged the abuses he saw in the church, and his work eventually led to the Protestant



Reformation. Luther's accomplishments included liturgical reform, translation of the Bible, and creation of the Small and Large Catechisms.



Polycarp, Bishop of Smyrna, martyr, died 156

Thursday, February 23, 2023

Because he is said to have been known by John, the author of Revelation, as well as the important early church fathers Irenaeus and Ignatius, Polycarp serves as a vital link in church history. He was burned at the stake at age 86 for refusing to renounce his faith.
