This Week's Observances

It's difficult not to be aware that a certain celebration will be taking place this weekend. The newspapers and other media have been announcing it for weeks, Pittsburgh will host one of the biggest parades in the nation on Saturday, articles have been crammed with tips on authentic Irish food to prepare, advertisements for the purchase of proper libations abound and many establishments offer deals for celebrating the day. This takes place in the secular world and can be a lot of fun.

Christians have two observances to commemorate, **two Saints are remembered**, **St. Patrick and St. Joseph**, the dates being the 17th and 19th respectively. One has become more known for the commercial exploitation that is associated with it rather than its significance to the Church.

The real Patrick was born into a wealthy Christian family in Roman Britain A.D. 385 and as a teenager was captured and sent as a slave to Ireland. Escaping after six years and going home he studied to be a priest eventually returning to Ireland as a missionary to minister to the Christians already there and converting many more to the faith. He died on March 17, A.D. 461, though never canonized by the Church, which observes the day, he became known as a Saint by popular demand in Ireland and as the Irish spread throughout the world his commemoration followed.

Joseph, Guardian of our Lord, like Patrick, was not canonized by the Church for the position he holds in the life of the Church is far above what humans could honor. Little is known of his life and nothing is mentioned of him after Jesus at age 12 was found in the Temple in Jerusalem talking to the teachers and scholars. He is regarded as the patron saint of workers. Pope Pius IX declared him to the patron and protector of the Church. ~

FIFTH SUNDAY IN LENT Called Where Jesus Goes

It isn't only the first disciples who become uncomfortable when Jesus talked about his approaching death. We often do as well. Perhaps focusing on the crucifixion seems gruesome. Perhaps it conjures in us the (false) story of a divine parent who cannot forgive without punishing someone, with Jesus standing in as that one. Maybe it feels like a morbid emphasis on sin.

Jesus did not understand himself as the victim of divine punishment. He entered into suffering as a part of his glorification, working with—not against—his Father. He knows that human life has become twisted under the powers of sin and death so that if we grasp onto our "life in this world," we will miss God's gracious intention for us. Christ's judgment of sin is not for our exclusion. Jesus never seeks to shame us, but condemns sin in order to deliver us from its power.

Perhaps, however, we shy away from talk of Christ's death because we sense, on some level, that if our Lord must go to the cross, then so too must we. Jesus declares, "Whoever serves me must follow me." Discipleship is a summons to die to ourselves and lose our life on this world's terms. Paradoxically, this cruciform journey is the road to true fruitfulness and flourishing. It begins in our baptism and is nourished at the Lord's table. It is sustained by the fellowship of faith, where together we hear the life-giving word of Jesus. It will find completion on the day of resurrection.

Our souls long for this way of salvation. Deep within us all, a voice whispers, "We wish to see Jesus." God knows this need, so Jesus is lifted up to drive out the powers of sin and death. God's unending mercy is displayed. For the same reason, we come together so that in hearing the word and sharing the eucharistic meal, and in our prayers, laments, and praises, Jesus may be lifted up to draw us, and all people, to salvation. ~



Upcoming Commemorations



Patrick, bishop, missionary to Ireland, died 461

Sunday, March 17, 2024

A native of Britain, Patrick was kidnapped by pirates at age sixteen and sold into slavery in Ireland. After a few years, he escaped, returned home, and entered the ministry. Returning to Ireland, he successfully served as a bishop and missionary there.

Joseph, Guardian of Jesus Tuesday, March 19, 2024

Though the Bible tells us little about the husband of Jesus' mother Mary, we know that he was a carpenter or builder by trade. He is also shown as being devoted both to God and to Mary and Jesus. It is assumed that he died before Jesus became an adult.





Thomas Cranmer, Bishop of Canterbury, martyr, died 1556 Thursday, March 21, 2024

Cranmer's lasting achievement is contributing to and overseeing the creation of the Book of Common Prayer, which remains (in revised form) the worship book of the Anglican Communion. He was burned at the stake under Queen Mary for his support of the Protestant Reformation.

Jonathan Edwards, teacher, missionary to American Indians, died 1758 Friday, March 22, 2024

A Puritan minister in Connecticut, Edwards is remembered as being a great preacher. Though his most famous sermon talks at length about hell, he was more concerned with God's love. He served both as missionary to the Housatonic people in Massachusetts, and as president of the future Princeton University.
