



#### INFO ABOUT THE CHOIR ANTHEM

Today's selection by the choir, "Ave Verum Corpus," is composed by a musician who really needs no introduction: Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart. He composed this motet in June 1791 as a setting of a 14th-century Eucharistic hymn. Mozart wrote it as a gift for his friend, Anton Stoll, the choirmaster of a small church in Baden, Austria – a spa town where Mozart's wife was taking therapy during her pregnancy. It's been said that Ave Verum is one of the most simple and perfect expressions of devotion ever composed. This amazing little work grounded in text that speaks to Christ's redeeming death on the cross and his true presence in the bread and wine of the altar - is quite heavenly and can and can create a sense of otherworldly peace for those who perform it and those who listen to the music. The English translation of the Latin text is: "Hail, true Body, born of the Virgin Mary, having truly suffered, sacrificed on the cross for mankind, from whose pierced side water and blood flowed: Be for us a sweet foretaste in the trial of death!"
